
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE FOOD SYSTEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a sustainable food
2 system is one in which producers, retailers, members of the
3 community, non-governmental organizations, and government
4 agencies partner to create a vibrant and resilient local food
5 economy that enhances and sustains the environmental, economic,
6 and social health of the community.

7 The legislature further finds that developing a more
8 sustainable food system for Hawaii represents an opportunity to
9 create a new food economy that integrates the objectives of
10 "green" job creation, sustainable economic development, land
11 stewardship, food security, environmental protection, and
12 climate change resiliency with community health and well-being.

13 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish within
14 the department of agriculture the sustainable food systems
15 working group to develop an interagency food systems plan.

16 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department
17 of agriculture the sustainable food systems working group. The



1 working group shall identify a governance structure and
2 implementation plan for an interagency food systems plan linked
3 to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals for a more
4 sustainable, resilient local food economy that enhances and
5 sustains the environmental, economic, and social health of the
6 community.

7 (b) The sustainable food systems working group shall be
8 composed of the following members:

- 9 (1) One member of the house of representatives, to be
10 selected by the speaker of the house of
11 representatives;
- 12 (2) One member of the senate, to be selected by the
13 president of the senate;
- 14 (3) A representative of the Hawaii tourism authority, to
15 be selected by the president and chief executive
16 officer of the Hawaii tourism authority;
- 17 (4) Two representatives of the University of Hawaii system
18 who have experience in food systems, to be selected by
19 the dean of the college of tropical agriculture and
20 human resources;



- 1 (5) A representative of the department of agriculture, to
2 be selected by the chairperson of the board of
3 agriculture;
- 4 (6) A representative of the department of health, to be
5 selected by the director of health;
- 6 (7) A representative of the office of Hawaiian affairs, to
7 be selected by the chairperson of the board of
8 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs;
- 9 (8) A representative of the office of climate change,
10 sustainability and resiliency of the city and county
11 of Honolulu, to be selected by the chief resilience
12 officer and executive director of the office of
13 climate change, sustainability and resiliency of the
14 city and county of Honolulu;
- 15 (9) The food access coordinators of the city and county of
16 Honolulu and the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai;
- 17 (10) A representative of the department of Native Hawaiian
18 health of the John A. Burns school of medicine of the
19 university of Hawaii, to be selected by the chair of
20 the department of Native Hawaiian health;



- 1 (11) Two persons with familiarity, experience, or expertise
- 2 in the Native Hawaiian community, to be selected by
- 3 the chairperson of the board of agriculture; provided
- 4 that one of the members shall be a resident of a
- 5 county other than the city and county of Honolulu;
- 6 (12) A representative of the Hawaii Farm Bureau, to be
- 7 selected by the president of the Hawaii Farm Bureau;
- 8 (13) A representative of the Hawaii Foodbank, to be
- 9 selected by the president and chief executive officer
- 10 of the Hawaii Foodbank;
- 11 (14) A representative of the agricultural sector, to be
- 12 selected by the chairperson of the board of
- 13 agriculture;
- 14 (15) Four farmers, with each farmer representing one of the
- 15 counties of Hawaii, Kauai, or Maui, or the city and
- 16 county of Honolulu, to be selected by the chairperson
- 17 of the board of agriculture;
- 18 (16) Four representatives of the agricultural sector, of
- 19 which each member shall represent one of the counties
- 20 of Hawaii, Kauai, Maui, or the city and county of



1 Honolulu, to be selected by the respective mayor of
2 each county;

3 (17) A representative of the farm-to-school community in
4 Hawaii, to be selected by the chairperson of the board
5 of agriculture;

6 (18) A representative of the Hawaii Foodservice Alliance,
7 to be selected by the owner of the Hawaii Foodservice
8 Alliance;

9 (19) A representative of the Hawaii Food Industry
10 Association, to be selected by the executive director
11 of the Hawaii Food Industry Association;

12 (20) A representative of the Hawaii Farmers Union United;

13 (21) A representative of the Hawaii Cattlemen's Council,
14 Inc., to be selected by the president of the Hawaii
15 Cattlemen's Council, Inc.;

16 (22) A representative of the Hawaii Fishermen's Alliance
17 for Conservation and Tradition, to be selected by the
18 president of the Hawaii Fishermen's Alliance for
19 Conservation and Tradition; and

20 (23) A representative of the commercial fishing sector of
21 the State, to be selected by the administrator of the



1 department of land and natural resources division of
2 aquatic resources.

3 (c) The chairperson of the board of agriculture shall
4 serve as chair of the sustainable food systems working group.

5 (d) The interagency food systems plan shall:

6 (1) Address the following:

7 (A) Food as a human right and healthy food for all;

8 (B) Social equity and food justice;

9 (C) Food system resilience;

10 (D) Agriculture and food system sustainability;

11 (E) Food at the center of a circular economy;

12 (F) Sustainable education, workforce development, and
13 fair labor; and

14 (G) Good food governance; and

15 (2) Incorporate the county food access plans.

16 (e) The sustainable food systems working group shall
17 submit its plan and any recommendations for implementation of
18 the plan, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature
19 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
20 session of 2025.



1 (f) The department of agriculture shall provide any
2 necessary staff support, including for the preparation of the
3 plan identified in subsection (a), to the sustainable food
4 systems working group.

5 (g) The sustainable food systems working group shall be
6 dissolved on June 30, 2025.

7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
10 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
11 year 2024-2025 for the purpose of establishing the sustainable
12 food systems working group and implementing section 2 of this
13 Act, including coordinating stakeholder meetings; managing
14 public meetings and website data management in accordance with
15 chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes; writing and printing the
16 plan; and potentially obtaining services on a fee.

17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
18 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

19 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and



1 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
2 year 2024-2025 for full-time equivalent (FTE)
3 sustainability specialist position in the department of
4 agriculture.

5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
6 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.

Requires the working group to submit a plan, any recommendations for implementing the plan, and any proposed legislation to the Legislature. Appropriates funds to establish the working group and develop the plan and for an unspecified number of sustainability specialist positions to be employed by the DOA. Effective 6/30/3000. (SD1)
