A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUICIDE PREVENTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) There is established a prevent suicide
- 2 Hawaii working group within the office of wellness and
- 3 resilience for administrative purposes only. The prevent
- 4 suicide Hawaii working group shall examine, evaluate, and
- 5 determine methods to improve education, awareness, support
- 6 services, and outreach to best prevent suicides in the State,
- 7 particularly among Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, farmers,
- 8 youth, LGBTQIA+, veterans, and other populations identified by
- 9 the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as a
- 10 high-risk population for suicide. The prevent suicide Hawaii
- 11 working group shall also implement the recommendations in the
- 12 interim report issued by the prevent suicide Hawaii task force
- 13 pursuant to H.C.R. No. 66, S.D. 1 (2016).
- 14 (b) The prevent suicide Hawaii working group shall consist
- 15 of at least the following members:

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I	(1)	Executive director of the office of wellness and
2		resilience, who shall serve as the chair of the
3		working group;
4	(2)	One member to be appointed by the Substance Abuse and
5		Mental Health Services Administration of the United
6		States Department of Health and Human Services;
7	(3)	One representative from the department of health's
8		behavioral health services administration, to be
9		appointed by the director of health;
10	(4)	The suicide prevention coordinator from the department
11		of health's emergency medical services and injury
12		prevention system branch;
13	(5)	One member from the department of education, to be
14		appointed by the superintendent of education;
15	(6)	One member from the department of human services, to
16		be appointed by the director of human services;
17	(7)	One member from the department of public safety, or
18		its successor agency, to be appointed by the director
19		of public safety or the director of the successor
20		agency;

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1	(8)	One member to be appointed by the dean of the
2		university of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine,
3		from its department of psychiatry;
4	(9)	One member from the judiciary, to be appointed by the
5		chief justice of the Hawaii supreme court;
6	(10)	One at-large member from each county, to be appointed
7		by the governor;
8	(11)	One member to be appointed by the president of the
9		senate;
10	(12)	One member to be appointed by the speaker of the house
11		of representatives;
12	(13)	Two members from a youth leadership suicide prevention
13		organization, to be appointed by the president of the
14		senate and the speaker of the house of representatives
15		respectively; and
16	(14)	One member from a Native Hawaiian health and well-
17		being organization, to be appointed by the governor.
18	(c)	In addition to the members listed in subsection (b),
19	the chair	of the prevent suicide Hawaii working group shall
20	invite the	e following individuals to participate:

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1	(1)	The su	icide	preventi	lon	program	manager	for	the	United
2		States	Army	Reserve	in	Hawaii;				

- 3 (2) One member from each branch of the United States Armed4 Forces;
- 5 (3) Two members from suicide prevention organizations; and
- 6 (4) One member from a mental health advocacy organization.
- 7 (d) The prevent suicide Hawaii working group shall report
- 8 its findings and recommendations, including any proposed
- 9 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 10 to the convening of the regular session of 2025.
- 11 (e) Members of the prevent suicide Hawaii working group
- 12 shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
- 13 reasonable expenses necessary for the performance of their
- 14 duties, including travel expenses.
- 15 (f) No member of the prevent suicide Hawaii working group
- 16 shall be subject to chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely
- 17 because of the member's participation in the working group.
- 18 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 2050.

Description:

Establishes a Prevent Suicide Hawaii Working Group within the Office of Wellness and Resilience. Requires the working group to: focus on preventing suicides in the State, particularly among Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, farmers, youth, LGBTQIA+, veterans, and other populations identified by the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as a high-risk population for suicide; implement recommendations in the Prevent Suicide Hawaii Task Force's interim report; and report to the Legislature before the Regular Session of 2025.
