BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The department of health and department of
- 2 human services shall develop and adopt rules, policies, and plan
- 3 amendments necessary to ensure that the state medicaid program
- 4 covers medically-needed services, including applied behavior
- 5 analysis services, for individuals aged twenty—one and older
- 6 with neurodevelopmental disorders, including autism spectrum
- 7 disorder.
- 8 SECTION 2. The department of health and department of
- 9 human services shall apply for any necessary approvals from the
- 10 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to amend the state
- 11 medicaid plan to provide reimbursements for medically-needed
- 12 services, including applied behavior analysis services to
- 13 medicaid-eligible persons over the age of twenty-one diagnosed
- 14 with an autism spectrum disorder.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
