A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The legislature finds that establishing a
2	permanent	educational support associate position placed within
3	the unive	rsity of Hawaiʻi college of tropical agriculture and
4	human reso	ources (CTAHR) is needed to successfully implement the
5	following	goals of the college's cooperative extension program:
6	(1)	Providing non-formal science-based education;
7	(2)	Acting as the outreach component of the university of
8		Hawai'i college of tropical agriculture and human
9		resources; and
10	(3)	Extending practical applications of science to support
11		local food systems, healthy living, youth development,
12		and the stewardship of natural resources for future
13		generations.
14	The I	legislature further finds that CTAHR's Kona cooperative
15	extension,	which houses the Kona research station, provides
16	crucial su	apport for local coffee farmers statewide, who
17	currently	face dire threats to their crops from the recently

- 1 discovered coffee berry borer and from coffee leaf rust. With a
- 2 farm-gate value of approximately \$48.4 million, and an unroasted
- 3 value of \$101.5 million, the coffee industry represents the
- 4 State's third-highest valued agricultural commodity. Despite
- 5 this, the coffee industry is currently served statewide by just
- 6 one CTAHR extension agent.
- 7 The legislature further finds that CTAHR's sole extension
- 8 agent is currently supported by just one educational support
- 9 associate position, which has historically been one hundred per
- 10 cent grant funded. Due to varying grant provisions, the
- 11 position is limited to work only within the scope of funded
- 12 projects and is unable to address the needs and challenges of
- 13 other industries supported by CTAHR's cooperative extension
- 14 program. Additionally, upwards of thirty to forty-seven per
- 15 cent of current grant funding is dedicated to salary and fringe
- 16 benefits for project support staff, which reduces funding for
- 17 educational events, applied research, travel for statewide
- 18 outreach, equipment, and materials and supplies that could
- 19 directly benefit local farmers and producers.
- The legislature further finds that establishing a permanent
- 21 educational support associate position will provide much needed

- 1 support to extension faculty; enable the prioritization of
- 2 research and community outreach projects throughout the State;
- 3 and support the Kona research station, which encompasses
- 4 eighteen acres of projects related to coffee, including coffee
- 5 leaf rust and coffee berry borer mitigation, as well as
- 6 macadamia, avocado, temperate fruit and nut germplasm, two-lined
- 7 spittlebug, tree pruning, grafting, and propagation, organic and
- 8 conventional pesticides, and nematode management.
- 9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish and
- 10 fund one full-time educational support associate position,
- 11 within the university of Hawai'i college of tropical agriculture
- 12 and human resources' coffee and orchard crops cooperative
- 13 extension and applied research program, to provide
- 14 administrative, professional, and technical support to the
- 15 college's cooperative extension program, Kona research station,
- 16 and the State's highly valued agricultural industries that are
- 17 challenged with economically damaging pest, disease, and
- 18 production issues.
- 19 SECTION 2. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 20 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
- 21 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the

- 1 appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,
- 2 and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure
- 3 ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
- 4 \$ or per cent. This current declaration takes
- 5 into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal
- 6 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act
- 7 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure
- 8 ceiling are that:
- 9 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
- serve the public interest; and
- 11 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
- addressed by this Act.
- 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$76,570 or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the
- 16 establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent
- 17 educational support associate position within the university of
- 18 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources' Kona
- 19 cooperative extension to support the coffee and orchard crops
- 20 extension and applied research program and the Kona research
- 21 station in the county of Hawai'i.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the university of
- 2 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
