A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BOARD MEETINGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 92-3.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
- 3 "(a) A board [may] shall hold a remote meeting by
- 4 interactive conference technology; provided that the interactive
- 5 conference technology used by the board allows audiovisual
- 6 interaction among all members of the board participating in the
- 7 meeting and all members of the public attending the meeting,
- 8 except as otherwise provided under this section; provided
- 9 further that there is at least one meeting location that is open
- 10 to the public and has an audiovisual connection. A board
- 11 holding a remote meeting pursuant to this section shall not be
- 12 required to allow members of the public to join board members in
- 13 person at nonpublic locations where board members are physically
- 14 present or to identify those locations in the notice required by
- 15 section 92-7; provided that at the meeting, each board member
- 16 shall state who, if anyone, is present at the nonpublic location
- 17 with the member. The notice required by section 92-7 shall:

4		(A)	Remotely view the video and audio of the meeting
5			through internet streaming or other means; and

7			allows board members and other meeting
8			participants to hear the testimony, whether
9			through an internet link, a telephone conference,
10			or other means.

19	(b)	For a	a remote meeting held by interactive conference
20	technology	y purs	suant to this section:

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1	(1)	The interactive conference technology used by the
2		board shall allow interaction among all members of the
3		board participating in the meeting and all members of
4		the public attending the meeting;
5	(2)	Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d), a
6		quorum of board members participating in the meeting
7		shall be visible and audible to other members and the
8		public during the meeting; provided that no other
9		meeting participants shall be required to be visible
10		during the meeting;
11	(3)	Any board member participating in a meeting by
12		interactive conference technology shall be considered
13		present at the meeting for the purpose of determining
14		compliance with the quorum and voting requirements of
15		the board;
16	(4)	At the start of the meeting the presiding officer
17		shall announce the names of the participating members;
18	(5)	All votes shall be conducted by roll call unless
19		unanimous; and
20	(6)	Boards shall record meetings open to the public, when
21		practicable, and make the recording of any meeting

1	electronically available to the public as soon as
2	practicable after a meeting and until a time as the
3	minutes required by section 92-9 are electronically
4	posted and archived on the board's website. Boards
5	are encouraged to keep recordings available on their
6	website."
7	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
