### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHORE SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 346-64.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+] §346-64.5[+] Eligibility for chore services. (a) An
- 4 applicant for chore services shall be eligible when the
- 5 applicant meets program requirements for chore services and
- 6 income eligibility standards as established by the department of
- 7 human services.
- 8 (b) Program requirements to determine an applicant's
- 9 eligibility for chore services pursuant to subsection (a) shall
- 10 include an assessment of whether the applicant has a family
- 11 member who is capable of providing chore services and the types
- 12 and extent of chore services the family member is capable of
- 13 providing for the applicant. The assessment shall include a
- 14 determination of whether the family member has:
- 15 (1) The physical and mental ability to perform each type
- of chore service necessary for the applicant, which

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1		shall be certified by a physician licensed pursuant to
2		chapter 453 who has examined the family member; and
3	(2)	Sufficient time to perform necessary chore services
4		for the applicant, which shall be determined by an
5		independent third party who is not an employee or
6		agent of an insurance company or the department.
7	<u>(c)</u>	Income eligibility standards for chore services
8	pursuant	to subsection (a) shall include [individuals who have]
9	an assess	ment of the applicant to determine whether the
10	individual:	
11	(1)	<u>Has</u> been found eligible for medical assistance under
12		the department's medicaid program[-]; and
13	(2)	Has the ability to pay a portion of the cost share of
14		the chore services with any balance to be covered by
15		the individual's insurance plan or the department's
16		program;
17	provided	that the individual satisfies all other applicable
18	program r	equirements and income eligibility standards.
19	[ <del>-(b)</del> -	] (d) For the purposes of this section[, "chore]:
20	"Chore services" means essential housecleaning and related	
21	activitie	s such as marketing cooking and cleaning

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1	"Fam:	ily member" means an applicant's spouse, child,
2	grandchile	d, parent, grandparent, or any individual related by
3	blood, ma	rriage, adoption, or legal guardianship, or as
4	reciproca	l beneficiaries, who resides in the same household of
5	the appli	cant."
6	SECT	ION 2. (a) To improve access for disabled persons
7	seeking c	hore services, the department of human services shall:
8	(1)	Improve and streamline the application and approval
9		process for "DHS form 1147" by eliminating the rating
10		and ranking of a disabled applicant's disability for
11		purposes of qualifying to receive chore services.
12		Application approval shall not consider the quantity
13		of services needed or the severity of the applicant's
14		disability to determine priority of an individual's
15		application;
16	(2)	Pursue all available federal funding sources to
17		maximize state program availability and reimbursement
18		for chore services;
19	(3)	Consider establishment of a dependent care loan
20		program that would loan funds to qualified individuals
21		to pay for chore service expenses, who could then

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1	claim a tax credit that, once refunded, would enable
2	them to repay the department for the dependent care
3	loan;

- (4) Expand the first to work program to include training and assistance to help unemployed individuals sign up to become freelance chore services workers, which shall include:
  - (A) Assisting in self-employment processes for applicants to become simple sole proprietors to serve as chore service workers; and
  - (B) Working with the department of labor and industrial relations to publish a list of freelance chore service workers' contact information, with ratings submitted by chore service clients, to be posted on the department of labor and industrial relations' website and the department of human services' MedQUEST website.
- (b) The department of human services shall submit a report
  of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed
  legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior

- 1 to the convening of the regular session of 2025, concerning the
- 2 status of items specified in subsection (a).
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 9 provided that section 1 of this Act shall take effect upon
- 10 approval by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

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#### Report Title:

DHS; Chore Services; Eligibility; Program Requirements; Income Eligibility Standards; Report

#### Description:

Requires the Department of Human Services' program requirements for chore services to include an assessment of whether the applicant has a family member who is available and capable of providing necessary chore services for the applicant. Requires income eligibility standards for chore services to include an assessment of whether the individual has the ability to pay a portion of the cost of the chore services they receive. Requires the Department of Human Services to improve access for disabled persons seeking chore services by taking certain actions and submitting a report to the Legislature.
