A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII FARM TO FOOD BANK PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish and
2 appropriate funds for the Hawaii farm to food bank program to
3 fund food banks and emergency feeding organizations in the State
4 to purchase, store, and transport fresh locally grown or
5 produced food to food insecure communities. This program will
6 serve the State's food needs, provide local food producers with
7 a market to support their operations, and keep moneys
8 circulating within the State to boost the local economy.

9 SECTION 2. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
11 to read as follows:

12 **"PART . HAWAII FARM TO FOOD BANK PROGRAM**

13 **§141- Definitions.** For the purposes of this part:

14 "Department" means the department of agriculture.

15 "Food bank" has the same meaning as in title 7 United
16 States Code section 7501(5).



1 "Fresh locally grown or produced food" means fruits,
2 vegetables, nuts, coffee, eggs, poultry and poultry products,
3 livestock products, milk and milk products, aquacultural and
4 maricultural products, and horticultural products that are one
5 hundred per cent grown, raised, and harvested in Hawaii.

6 **§141- Hawaii farm to food bank program.** (a) There is
7 established the Hawaii farm to food bank program to be
8 administered by the department. Under the program, the
9 department shall relieve food shortages by providing funds to
10 food banks and emergency feeding organizations located in the
11 State to facilitate consistent supply chains of fresh locally
12 grown or produced food that is culturally relevant to food
13 insecure communities.

14 (b) Food banks and emergency feeding organizations that
15 receive support pursuant to this section shall use the funds to
16 purchase, store, and transport fresh locally grown or produced
17 in the State that is culturally relevant to recipients at no
18 cost to the recipients.

19 **§141- Hawaii food assistance program special fund.** (a)
20 There is established in the state treasury the Hawaii food



1 assistance program special fund, into which shall be deposited
2 the following:

3 (1) Appropriations made by the legislature to the special
4 fund;

5 (2) Gifts, donations, and grants from public agencies and
6 private persons; and

7 (3) Interest accrued from moneys in the special fund.

8 (b) Expenditures from the Hawaii food assistance program
9 special fund shall be authorized and administered by the
10 department for the purposes of the Hawaii farm to food bank
11 program.

12 **§141- Rules.** The department shall adopt rules pursuant
13 to chapter 91 necessary for the purposes of this part."

14 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
17 deposited into the Hawaii food assistance program special fund.

18 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii food
19 assistance program special fund the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much
20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for uses



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1 consistent with the purposes of the Hawaii food assistance
2 program special fund.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
4 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
6 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
7 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
8 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
9 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
10 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
11 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
12 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
13 exceeded by \$5,000,000 or per cent. The combined total
14 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
15 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
16 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
17 \$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
18 general fund expenditure ceiling are that:

- 19 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
20 serve the public interest; and



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1 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
2 addressed by this Act.

3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
