## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the condominium		
2	property regime task force was established pursuant to Act 189,		
3	Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, which met on September 11, 2023;		
4	October 27, 2023; November 30, 2023; and December 14, 2023, to		
5	develop recommendations as part of its interim report to the		
6	legislature before the start of the regular session of 2024.		
7	Task force members sought and received information from the		
8	department of commerce and consumer affairs and several members		
9	of the public submitted written testimony and presented oral		
10	comments during hybrid remote and in-person meetings held by the		
11	task force. Links to the task force meetings and written		
12	materials have been made available on the department of commerce		
13	and consumer affairs' website and the legislature's website.		
14	The interim report requested that the legislative reference		
15	bureau study and report to the legislature on certain subjects		
16	concerning condominiums to enable the task force to better		
17	recommend legislation on an informed and objective basis.		

1	Acco	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
2	(1)	Require the legislative reference bureau to conduct a
3		study on how certain other states approach certain
4		subjects as they relate to condominiums; and
5	(2)	Make an appropriation.
6	SECT	ION 2. (a) The legislative reference bureau shall
7	study and	submit a report on the approaches employed by certain
8	other sta	tes regarding the following condominium subjects:
9	(1)	A condominium ombudsman or similar position to
10		specifically oversee condominiums;
11	(2)	Required licenses for individuals involved in the
12		management of condominiums;
13	(3)	The availability of dedicated alternative dispute
14		resolution or similar programs that are specifically
15		for the prevention or resolution of condominium-
16		related disputes and are separate from alternative
17		dispute resolution programs available for other
18		disputes;
19	(4)	Governmental regulation and enforcement of condominium
20		operations and governance that are separate from an
21		ombudsman referenced in paragraph (1);

- (5) Requirements for owner education at the point of sale
   of a unit; and
- 3 (6) Requirements for owner access to condominium4 documents.
- 5 (b) To the extent feasible, each subject shall include:
- 6 (1) Descriptive information detailing the approach of each7 jurisdiction;
- 8 (2) Identified strengths and weaknesses of each particular9 approach; and
- 10 (3) Identified best practices in the jurisdiction.
- 11 (c) The jurisdictions to be studied shall be:
- 12 (1) California;
- 13 (2) Delaware;
- **14** (3) Florida;
- 15 (4) Massachusetts;
- **16** (5) Nevada; and
- 17 (6) Any other jurisdiction deemed relevant by the legislative reference bureau.
- 19 (d) The legislative reference bureau shall submit the
- 20 report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
- 21 convening of the regular session of 2026.

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SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
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    the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
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    37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
    that the appropriation contained in this Act will cause the
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    state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
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    to be exceeded by $

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    for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the
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    appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public
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    interest and to meet the needs provided for by this Act.
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         SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
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    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $

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    thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the
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    legislative reference bureau to conduct a study of condominium
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    subjects in other states as specified in section 2 of this Act.
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         The sum appropriated shall be expended by the legislative
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    reference bureau for the purposes of this Act.
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         SECTION 5. The legislative reference bureau may contract
    the services of a consultant with the funds appropriated in
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    section 4 of this Act. The contracting of services under this
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    Act shall be exempt from chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

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## Report Title:

LRB; Condominiums; Study; Report; Appropriation; Expenditure Ceiling

## Description:

Requires the Legislative Reference Bureau to conduct a study on how certain other states approach the following subjects as they relate to condominiums: ombudsman programs, licensing for management, alternative dispute resolution, governmental regulation, owner education, and owner access to documents. Makes an appropriation. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. (SD1)

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
