A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that urban temperatures
- 2 are expected to rise significantly, particularly due to the loss
- 3 of shade and increase in concrete in urban areas, such as
- 4 highways. The difference in temperatures on an urban street
- 5 having trees and cooling strategies versus one not having trees
- 6 and cooling strategies can be as much as fifteen to twenty
- 7 degrees on a hot day. During hot summers, extreme heat can lead
- 8 to death and contribute to the loss of economic activity. The
- 9 proliferation of hardening structures and concrete throughout
- 10 Hawaii also impacts the visitor experience, which has been noted
- 11 by foreign visitor bureaus. Studies have also found that
- 12 residents' stress levels and quality of life are also impacted
- 13 in urban areas, and that green, cool urban environments can help
- 14 to reduce stress and improve mental and physical health. The
- 15 legislature believes that efforts to mitigate the effects of
- 16 increasing temperatures necessitates urgent action.

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- 1 The legislature notes that the cost of maintaining greener
- 2 highway corridors is estimated to be \$60,000 per mile. The
- 3 legislature also notes that new temperature mitigation
- 4 techniques and strategies used around the world have shown that
- 5 this cost can be reduced, with minimal or no regular maintenance
- 6 required, by using appropriate plant species. The legislature
- 7 also believes that making the State's highway corridors greener
- 8 now will help to reduce the potential financial burden placed on
- 9 taxpayers in the future.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish the
- 11 greener highway corridors pilot project to improve the H-1
- 12 freeway corridor with greenery.
- 13 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department
- 14 of transportation the greener highway corridors pilot project to
- 15 be administered by a representative of the department of
- 16 transportation having expertise in arboriculture, who shall be
- 17 selected by the director of transportation.
- 18 (b) The purpose of the pilot project shall be to reduce
- 19 urban temperatures, sequester carbon emissions, reduce noise in
- 20 areas surrounding the H-1 freeway, and improve the visual
- 21 appearance of the H-1 freeway.

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              The department of transportation shall select one or
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    more portions of the H-1 freeway corridor located between Middle
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    Street and Kapahulu Avenue in which to plant vegetation for the

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              The department of transportation shall submit a report
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    on the status of the pilot project to the legislature no later
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    than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session,
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    and a final report not later than twenty days prior to the
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    convening of the regular session of
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              The pilot project shall be dissolved on June 30,
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         SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
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    the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
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    37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
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    that the appropriation contained in this Act will cause the
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    state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
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    to be exceeded by $

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    for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the
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    appropriation made in this Act appropriation necessary to serve
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    the public interest and to meet the need provided for by this
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    Act.
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- 1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the
- 4 implementation of the greener highway corridors pilot project
- 5 pursuant to this Act.

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- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
