A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN BENEFICIARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that while basic waiting
- 2 lists of department of Hawaiian home lands homestead lease
- 3 applicants are available for download on the department's
- 4 website, the exact details of each applicant, including
- 5 information regarding whether the person has applied for
- 6 multiple leases, been denied a prior lease, or been skipped
- 7 over, are not readily accessible, even for department staff.
- 8 Beneficiary records of the department of Hawaiian home lands are
- 9 spread across multiple locations. If a beneficiary seeks to
- 10 determine the beneficiary's status, finding and gathering that
- 11 information can require weeks of work.
- 12 The legislature further finds that the compilation of
- 13 applicant information into a single interactive database would
- 14 increase efficiency within the department of Hawaiian home
- 15 lands. A digital database would provide clear, transparent,
- 16 current, and timely information to beneficiaries and the public.

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- 1 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the
- 2 department of Hawaiian home lands to complete an assessment and
- 3 report on the feasibility of creating an interactive digital
- 4 database software program that compiles information from its
- 5 beneficiary waiting lists and other related data.
- 6 SECTION 2. (a) The department of Hawaiian home lands,
- 7 with the assistance of the office of enterprise technology
- 8 services, shall complete an assessment and report on the
- 9 feasibility of creating an interactive digital database software
- 10 program compiling its applicant, beneficiary, and lessee
- 11 records. The interactive digital database software program
- 12 shall contain relevant information on each individual's
- 13 homestead lease application status, number of applications,
- 14 address, number of denied leases, designated successors, history
- 15 of obtaining leases as an applicant or as a successor, and other
- 16 relevant information as determined by the Hawaiian homes
- 17 commission.
- 18 (b) The department of Hawaiian home lands shall submit a
- 19 report of its findings and recommendations, including any
- 20 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than July 1,
- 21 2025.

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- 1 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 2 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
- 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
- 4 appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,
- 5 and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure
- 6 ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
- 7 \$ or per cent. This current declaration takes
- 8 into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal
- 9 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act
- 10 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure
- 11 ceiling are that:
- 12 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
- serve the public interest; and
- 14 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
- addressed by this Act.
- 16 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 18 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
- 19 the department of Hawaiian home lands to assess and report on
- 20 the feasibility of creating an interactive digital database

- 1 software program compiling the department of Hawaiian home
- 2 lands' applicant, beneficiary, and lessee records.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 Hawaiian home lands for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

Description:
