A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GENDER PARITY IN PROGRAMS FOR INCARCERATED WOMEN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that section 367D-1,
- 2 Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires parity in the programming
- 3 offered to women and men incarcerated in the State's
- 4 correctional facilities. More specifically, the section
- 5 provides in relevant part:
- 6 Adult women convicted of crimes and juvenile females
- 7 adjudicated for offenses that would be crimes if
- 8 committed by an adult or who are adjudicated delinquents
- 9 shall be provided a range and quality of programming
- 10 substantially equivalent to the range and quality of
- 11 programming offered to male persons who are similarly
- 12 situated.
- 13 These programs include educational development, job training,
- 14 substance abuse and cognitive-behavioral treatment services, and
- 15 cultural practices.
- 16 The legislature further finds that, based on the
- 17 information provided in the department of public safety's

- 2 community based programs for women, parity does not appear to
- 3 exist with respect to the range and quality of programming that
- 4 is currently available to female and male inmates in the State.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 6 Hawaii Friends of Restorative Justice as a grant to conduct a
- 7 study of programming offered to persons incarcerated at
- 8 correctional facilities and to convene a group of incarcerated
- 9 women for the purpose of identifying gaps in programming offered
- 10 to female inmates.
- 11 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 as a grant
- 14 pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to the Hawaii
- 15 Friends of Restorative Justice to conduct a study of programming
- 16 offered to persons incarcerated at correctional facilities and
- 17 to convene a group of incarcerated women to help identify gaps
- 18 in programming offered to female inmates; provided that the
- 19 Hawaii Friends of Restorative Justice shall use the report of
- 20 the task force convened by House Concurrent Resolution No. 85,
- 21 Regular Session of 2016, as a model to provide recommendations

- 1 to improve outcomes for incarcerated women; provided further
- 2 that the Hawaii Friends of Restorative Justice shall consult
- 3 with the interagency council on intermediate sanctions and
- 4 correctional program checklist committee when conducting the
- 5 study and making recommendations to improve outcomes for
- 6 incarcerated women; provided further that the Hawaii Friends of
- 7 Restorative Justice shall submit the study, including any
- 8 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than December
- 9 1, 2023.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary for
- 11 the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Description:

Appropriates funds to the Hawaii Friends of Restorative Justice as a chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, grant to conduct a study of all programming offered to persons incarcerated at correctional facilities and convene a group of incarcerated women for the purpose of identifying gaps in programming offered to female inmates. Requires that the study be submitted to the Legislature by 12/1/2023. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

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
