## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII PROFESSIONAL CHAPTER OF THE SOCIETY OF PROFESSIONAL JOURNALISTS TO RECOMMEND A PROCESS THAT INDIVIDUALS CAN UTILIZE TO EVALUATE AND IDENTIFY WHETHER OR NOT NEWS SOURCES ADHERE TO ETHICAL AND OBJECTIVE STANDARDS.

WHEREAS, the Society of Professional Journalists and 1 2 objective news adhere to a code of ethics and journalistic standards that can ensure objective reporting, truth, and 3 prevent the spread of misinformation; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the collapse of independent local media in the 6 digital economy has seen legacy media consolidate and become 7 increasingly more expensive to access for Americans and 8 residents of the State; and 9 10 WHEREAS, proliferation of social media has enabled some 11 organizations and individuals with broad reach presenting 12 themselves as news sources to intentionally or inadvertently 13 spread misinformation, making it difficult for the average 14 person to distinguish truth from fiction; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the continued advancements in artificial 17 intelligence have created a new tool to create and disseminate 18 unverifiable information more easily than ever before; and 19 20 WHEREAS, developing a way to recognize sources of news and 21 information that adhere to ethical, objective, journalistic 22 standards will help arm the public with a means to distinguish 23 between truth and misinformation; and 24 25 WHEREAS, with the rise and exacerbation of misinformation, 26 other states and countries have established task forces, media 27 literacy campaigns, and introduced legislation to mitigate the 28 harmful effects of misinformation; and 29 30

1 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Professional Chapter of the Society of 2 Professional Journalists has a responsibility to ensure that 3 information is reported with accuracy and objectivity that acts 4 in accordance with ethical standards; now, therefore, 5

6 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 7 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 8 House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii 9 Professional Chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists 10 is requested to recommend a process that individuals can utilize 11 to evaluate and identify whether or not news sources adhere to 12 ethical and objective standards; and 13

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Professional Chapter 15 of the Society of Professional Journalists is requested to 16 submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the 17 Legislature no later than forty days prior to the convening of 18 the Regular Session of 2025; and 19

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 21 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 22 Hawaii Professional Chapter of the Society of Professional 23 Journalists.
