SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO REQUIRE THE INSTRUCTION OF FINANCIAL LITERACY IN THE STATEWIDE PUBLIC SCHOOL CURRICULUM.

WHEREAS, the educational system has traditionally assumed 1 that students will acquire important financial skills from their 2 3 families; however, not all students are receiving the necessary instruction in financial skills that are crucial for their 4 5 future success; and 6 7 WHEREAS, parents and guardians play a crucial role in shaping their children's financial habits and attitudes; 8 however, many adults also struggle with financial literacy, 9 making it challenging for them to provide adequate financial 10 guidance and support to their children; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the lack of financial literacy can contribute to 13 poor financial decision-making within families, further 14 exacerbating the cycle of financial insecurity; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the lack of financial literacy in students 17 presents a significant barrier for individuals seeking to 18 achieve financial prosperity and security; and 19 20 WHEREAS, personal financial education is essential to 21 22 ensure that the youth of the State are prepared to manage money, credit, and debt; and to be responsible workers, heads of 23 households, investors, entrepreneurs, business leaders, and 24 25 citizens; and 26 WHEREAS, it is of the utmost importance to educate Hawaii's 27 youth in economical and financial matters to prepare them for 28 financial independence through the development of fiscal 29 30 responsibility and financial management skills; and 31



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WHEREAS, although the Department of Education offers a 1 financial literacy elective course, it is not required; and 2 3 WHEREAS, some amount of basic skills and knowledge of 4 financial literacy should be required for all students; now, 5 therefore, 6 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 9 House of Representatives concurring, that the Board of Education 10 is requested to require the instruction of financial literacy in 11 the statewide public school curriculum; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the instruction of financial 14 literacy be at both middle and high school levels and also 15 provide students with the basic information necessary to make 16 sound financial decisions; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education also is 19 requested to explore career and technical education and job 20 training opportunities for students that incorporate financial 21 literacy learning; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education also is 24 requested to promote opportunities for financial literacy 25 activities for family and guardians of students; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 29 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of Education and Superintendent of Education. 30 31 OFFERED BY: Danlige 32 33
