SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE TO BEGIN PLANNING TO COLLABORATE WITH PARTNERS IN JAPAN TO APPROPRIATELY RECOGNIZE THE EIGHTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE END OF WORLD WAR II, INCLUDING THE ATOMIC BOMBINGS AND LIVES LOST IN JAPAN AND HAWAII THROUGHOUT THE WAR, AND REAFFIRM A COMMITMENT TO ENSURING THESE TRAGEDIES ARE NEVER REPEATED.

WHEREAS, for generations Hawaii and Japan have shared a 1 common cultural heritage; and 2 3 WHEREAS, Hawaii lost over two thousand four hundred lives 4 at Pearl Harbor and other locations on December 7th, 1941, 5 including numerous civilians; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, Japan lost as many as 226,000 lives as a result of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in August 1945, 9 including numerous civilians; and 10 11 WHEREAS, countless others from Hawaii and Japan lost their 12 lives throughout World War II in battles throughout the Pacific 13 theater and around the world; and 14 15 WHEREAS, following the conclusion of World War II in the 16 Pacific, Hawaii and Japan have dedicated themselves to ensure an 17 enduring peace in the Pacific; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, the mutual respect and longstanding friendship between Hawaii and Japan has only deepened over the last eight 21 decades; and 22 23 WHEREAS, August 2025 will mark the eightieth anniversary of 24 25 the atomic bombings in Hiroshima and Nagasaki as well as the conclusion of World War II in the Pacific; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, true victory shall be measured not by the outcome of any battle, or who may prevail in any war, but rather by the 29 enduring determination to maintain peace so these costly lessons 30 are never again repeated; and 31 32

WHEREAS, properly recognizing and honoring the lives lost 1 in World War II, particularly at the anniversary of the bombings 2 of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, will reaffirm the lessons learned 3 from these tragedies, strengthen mutual respect and 4 understanding between our people, and reaffirm the deep 5 friendship between Japan and Hawaii for new and future 6 generations; now, therefore, 7

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 9 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 10 that the State is requested to begin planning to collaborate 11 with partners in Japan to appropriately recognize the eightieth 12 anniversary of the end of World War II, including the atomic 13 bombings and lives lost in Japan and Hawaii throughout the war, 14 and reaffirm a commitment to ensuring these tragedies are never 15 repeated; and 16

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Foundation on Culture 18 and the Arts is requested to plan and construct a memorial or 19 memorials, with the intention of offering one as a gift to the 20 people of Japan should they deem it appropriate, in a manner as 21 may be mutually agreeable to the appropriate partners in Hawaii 22 and Japan, to properly honor the lives lost in both places, in 23 particular innocent civilian casualties of war, and reinforce 24 that victory shall be measured not by the outcome of any battle, 25 or who may prevail in any war, but rather by the enduring 26 determination to maintain peace so these costly lessons are 27 never again repeated; and 28

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 30 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Director of Business, 31 Economic Development, and Tourism; and Executive Director of the 32 33 State Foundation on Culture and the Arts.
