SENATE RESOLUTION

REAFFIRMING THE STATE'S COMMITMENT TO PROVIDING CULTURALLY APPROPRIATE RESOURCES, SERVICES, AND PROGRAMS FOR NATIVE HAWAIIAN INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES EXPERIENCING INTELLECTUAL DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES.

WHEREAS, the State has committed to improving the quality 1 of life of individuals experiencing intellectual and 2 developmental disabilities, necessitating the provision of 3 4 relief to families and care providers; and 5 WHEREAS, the State continues to develop and identify the 6 scope of adequate address for the needs of individuals, 7 families, and care providers experiencing intellectual and 8 developmental disabilities, evidencing the ongoing need for 9 10 continued support; and 11 WHEREAS, intellectual and developmental disabilities are 12 often lifelong disabilities and differences that may involve 13 challenges that affect intellectual functioning and adaptive 14 15 functioning, or a person's ability to learn, reason, communicate, socialize, or perform self-care tasks; and 16 17 WHEREAS, developmental disabilities, which include 18 intellectual disabilities, are a broad group of conditions that 19 may involve an impairment in physical, learning, cognitive, 20 language and communication, or behavior areas; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the term "intellectual and developmental disabilities" was established and is continuously used to be 24 encompassing and far-reaching in its inclusivity, expressing the 25 community's diversity and recognizing individuals' unique 26 strengths, challenges, needs, and experiences; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities are beautiful and amazing, and the true extent of 30 their cognitive abilities is not accurately reflected by 31 32 measures of intelligence, as there are seemingly infinite ways that individuals learn or express themselves; and 33 34

WHEREAS, the intricate tapestry of humanity reveals that 1 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities are 2 unique in their own right, each person like all people, a 3 singular masterpiece, and the notion of a standardized, 4 universally applicable approach to support services is 5 insufficient to fully appreciate and provide appropriate support 6 for individuals' inherent uniqueness; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, it is our unwavering commitment to honor the intrinsic individuality of every person with an intellectual and 10 developmental disability, engaging in a collaborative process to 11 identify their unique and personal needs, and to develop and to 12 provide services, programs, and resources that not only uphold 13 their dignity and active inclusion as valued members of our 14 communities but also nurture their potential and safeguard their 15 well-being; and 16 17 WHEREAS, individuals with intellectual and developmental 18 disabilities have an inherent right to immerse themselves in 19 their cultural identities, necessitating the provision of 20 culturally appropriate and culturally sensitive services, 21 programs, and resources as essential to the adequacy of support 22 23 and inclusivity; and 24 WHEREAS, individuals with intellectual and developmental 25 disabilities and their families and care providers require 26 equitable resources and support, commensurate with their socio-27 economic standing, to endure in their everyday lives; and 28 29 WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon society to protect and 30 provide for our most vulnerable in ensuring that all people have 31 equitable opportunities and access to thrive; and 32 33 WHEREAS, Native Hawaiians are overrepresented among 34 individuals experiencing intellectual and developmental 35 disabilities, while also facing disproportionate underdiagnosis, 36 37 indicating systemic disparities and increased vulnerabilities; 38 and 39 WHEREAS, traditional Native Hawaiian family-based and 40 communal structures established systems of effective care for 41

individuals of all ages, including the most vulnerable members 1 2 of society; and 3 WHEREAS, these traditional family-based and communal 4 structures were dismantled and are furthered by unresolved 5 historical injustice; now, therefore, 6 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 8 9 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, that the Governor and this body are urged to commit to providing 10 culturally appropriate resources, services, and programs for 11 Native Hawaiian individuals and families experiencing 12

13 intellectual and developmental disabilities; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 15 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chairperson of the 16 Board of Land and Natural Resources, Chairperson of the Board of 17 Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, Director of Health, 18 Chairperson of the State Council on Developmental Disabilities, 19 Chairperson of the Board of Education, Superintendent of 20 Education Director of Human Services, President of the 21 University of Hawaii System, and Director of Business, Economic 22 Development, and Tourism. 23
