SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CARRY OUT WIDESPREAD SOIL TESTING IN LAHAINA AND TO DEVELOP A SOIL REMEDIATION PLAN.

WHEREAS, in August 2023, Lahaina, on the island of Maui, 1 experienced the fifth deadliest wildfire in United States 2 history; and 3 4 WHEREAS, more than two thousand two hundred structures were 5 damaged or destroyed in Lahaina and West Maui, eighty-six 6 7 percent of which were residences; and 8 WHEREAS, high-intensity wildfires such as the wildfire 9 10 experienced in Lahaina cause physical, chemical, and biological changes to the surrounding soil; and 11 12 WHEREAS, burned or melted building materials, furniture, 13 plastics, and consumer electronics produce toxic substances that 14 can also contaminate soil; and 15 16 WHEREAS, soil contamination caused by the August 2023 Maui 17 wildfire may threaten human health, groundwater quality, ocean 18 ecosystems, and food production; now, therefore, 19 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 22 that the Department of Health is requested to: 23 24 Sample and test the soil at numerous burn sites in 25 (1)Lahaina for toxins and contaminants; 26 27 Develop a soil remediation plan for areas of Lahaina 28 (2) 29 where soil contamination threatens human health, groundwater quality, ocean ecosystems, or food 30 production; 31 32 33 (3) Assess the feasibility of using available technologies to separate clean soil from ash and toxins; and 34



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1 2	(4) Submit a report of the Department's findings and
3	recommendations, including the expected costs and
4 5	estimated timeline for any needed soil remediation projects, and any proposed legislation, to the
6	Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
7	convening of the Regular Session of 2025; and

9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is
10 11	requested to seek funding for the development of the comprehensive soil remediation plan; and
12	comprehensive sorr remediation plan, and
13 14 15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health and Mayor of the County of Maui.
