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## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES TO ESTABLISH A WORKING GROUP TO PLAN AND CONSTRUCT A HAWAII FIRST RESPONDERS MEMORIAL.

WHEREAS, first responders often run toward emergencies and 1 disasters as others are fleeing toward safety; and 2 3 WHEREAS, first responders in Hawaii serve the community 4 5 courageously and heroically; and 6 WHEREAS, the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial in 7 Emmitsburg, Maryland, honors twenty-three firefighters from 8 Hawaii--twelve from the Honolulu Fire Department, one from the 9 Hawaii Fire Department, two from the Maui County Department of 10 Fire and Public Safety, one from the Kauai Fire Department, one 11 from the Division of Forestry and Wildlife of the Department of 12 13 Land and Natural Resources, three from the Pearl Harbor Naval Base, and three from the Hawaii Firefighters Association; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, according to the United States Fire Administration of the Federal Emergency Management Agency, ten firefighters in 17 Hawaii have died in the line of duty between 1990 to the 18 present--four from the Honolulu Fire Department, one from the 19 Hawaii Fire Department, two from the Maui County Department of 20 Fire and Public Safety, one from the Kauai Fire Department, one 21 from the Division of Forestry and Wildlife of the Department of 22 Land and Natural Resources, and one from the federal fire 23 24 department; and 25 WHEREAS, six paramedics, two medical flight nurses, and 26 four medical flight pilots from Hawaii have died in the line of 27 28 duty; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the National EMS Memorial Foundation seeks to establish a permanent National EMS Memorial; and 31 32



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WHEREAS, a similar, appropriate memorial to honor Hawaii 1 2 first responders should be located in the State; and 3 4 WHEREAS, with the construction of a Hawaii First Responders 5 Memorial, the State, along with the families, friends, and loved ones of fallen first responders, will forever honor their lives, 6 which were selflessly given in service to the people of Hawaii; 7 8 now, therefore, 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 11 that the Department of Accounting and General Services is 12 requested to establish a working group to plan and construct a 13 Hawaii First Responders Memorial; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 16 to consist of: 17 18 The Comptroller, or the Comptroller's designee, who is 19 (1)requested to serve as the chairperson of the working 20 group; 21 22 (2) The fire chiefs of the Honolulu Fire Department, 23 Hawaii Fire Department, Maui County Department of Fire 24 and Public Safety, and Kauai Fire Department, or their 25 respective designees; 26 27 (3) The Chief of Ocean Safety of the City and County of 28 Honolulu, a representative of the Hawaii Fire 29 Department with experience in ocean safety, the Chief 30 of the Ocean Safety Bureau of the Maui County 31 Department of Fire and Public Safety, and the head of 32 the Ocean Safety Bureau of the Kauai Fire Department, 33 or their respective designees; 34 35 36 (4) The Director of the Honolulu Emergency Services 37 Department, or the Director's designee; 38 (5) 39 A representative of American Medical Response in Hawaii; 40 41

19 20 21 22 23 24	(1)	Honor first responders, such as firefighters, lifeguards, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, medical flight nurses, and pilots, who, at the local, state, and federal levels of government, while in the line of duty, made the ultimate sacrifice to serve and protect the people of Hawaii;
25 26 27 28	(2)	Call attention to the bravery and spirit of public service that first responders demonstrate in the line of duty;
29 30	(3)	Be permanent and perpetual; and
31 32 33 34	(4)	Be constructed and maintained from private funds solicited for that purpose; and
35 36 37 38 39	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting and General Services is requested to coordinate all matters regarding the Hawaii First Responders Memorial, including but not limited to ongoing maintenance and repairs, either through private funds or funds allocated by the Legislature; and

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1 working group's plans, including findings, recommendations, projected costs, and any necessary legislation, to the 2 Legislature by November 30, 2024; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 5 6 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Comptroller; Fire Chief of each county; Chief of Ocean Safety of the City and 7 County of Honolulu; Chief of the Ocean Safety Bureau of the Maui 8 9 County Department of Fire and Public Safety; Head of the Ocean Safety Bureau of the Kauai Fire Department; Director of the 10 Honolulu Emergency Services Department; General Manager of 11 American Medical Response in Hawaii; President of the Hawaii 12 Firefighters Association, Local 1463, IAFF, AFL-CIO; State 13 14 Director of the United Public Workers, AFSCME Local 646, AFL-15 CIO; and Executive Director of the Hawaii Government Employees 16 Association, AFSCME Local 152, AFL-CIO.
