<u>SB 3237, SD2</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.	AGR, CPC, FIN
(SSCR3013)	Facilitates the control and eradication of invasive species and pests.	
<u>Status</u>	Establishes a plant nursery licensing program. Requires the	
	Department of Agriculture to designate certain species as pests for	
	control or eradication. Imposes certain limits on imports and	
	transportation. Updates the method by which the Department's	
	noxious weed list is updated. Takes effect 4/14/2112. (SD2)	



<u>SB 2500, SD2</u> ( <u>SSCR2776)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VALUE-ADDED PRODUCTS. Establishes a food and product innovation network within the Agribusiness Development Corporation. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025. Makes an appropriation for food and product innovation facilities on the islands of Molokai, Oahu, and Hawaii. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	AGR, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 572, SD2</u> ( <u>SSCR2809)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Authorizes the Department of Agriculture to declare a biosecurity emergency in certain circumstances and with the approval of the Governor. Outlines the terms of a declared biosecurity emergency. Requires the Department to implement certain requirements for agricultural commodity importers. Authorizes the Department to subpoena necessary documentation from agricultural commodity importers relating to a known or suspected infestation of pests. Authorizes the Department to quarantine any farm, facility, or business that is known to be infested with pests. (SD2)	AGR, JHA, FIN
<u>SB 3361</u> (SSCR3011) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RENEWABLE FUEL. Includes oilseed cover crops into the Cover Crop Reimbursement Pilot Program established by Act 312, SLH 2022.	AGR, FIN
<u>SB 3329, SD1</u> (SSCR2770) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LITTLE FIRE ANTS. Requires the disclosure of any little fire ant infestation as part of any sale of residential real property. (SD1)	AGR, CPC
<u>SB 3025</u> ( <u>SSCR2871)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEMP. Repeals the requirement for additional rules by the Department of Agriculture to address nuisance issues, including smell, noise, and excessive lighting arising out of the activities of hemp growers. Clarifies that the Department of Agriculture will not require testing or sampling of hemp that duplicates testing and sampling required by the United States Department of Agriculture, but retain the authority to enforce other applicable state laws, such as Hawaii Pesticides Law.	AGR, JHA
<u>SB 2401, SD2</u> ( <u>SSCR2907)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FERAL CHICKENS. Appropriates moneys to each county as a grant-in-aid for the implementation of feral chicken control programs. Appropriates moneys to the Department of Health for a feeding of feral animals education campaign. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	AGR, FIN
<u>SB 2413, SD2</u> ( <u>SSCR2785)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Requires the Board of Agriculture to submit a report on the percentage of agricultural lands that are suitable for farming and actively farmed and certain dollar amounts relating to lease transfers between lessees. (SD2)	AGR, FIN



<u>SB 2419, SD1</u> ( <u>SSCR2819)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL BIOSECURITY. Appropriates moneys for the biosecurity program of the Department of Agriculture to develop and implement projects for clean plant material, agricultural treatments, diagnostics, and pest management. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	AGR, FIN
<u>SB 2079</u> ( <u>SSCR3009)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF PLANTS AND ANIMALS. Allows the State of Hawaii Plant and Animal Declaration Form to be distributed, completed, and transmitted electronically.	AGR, FIN
<u>SB 2329, SD1</u> ( <u>SSCR2811)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AQUACULTURE. Appropriates moneys for mullet production for fishponds and stock enhancement, including for new positions, equipment, maintenance, and operating costs. Declares that the appropriations exceed the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	AGR, FIN
<u>SB 1590, SD1</u> ( <u>SSCR3056)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. Requires the Department of Agriculture to assess the steps necessary for the State to supplement federal authority to perform meat inspections within the State. Requires the Department of Agriculture to assess the steps necessary to transfer full authority over meat inspections from federal authority to the State. Appropriates funds for the establishment of three full-time equivalent (3.0 FTE) inspector positions within the Department of Agriculture to perform meat inspections. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)	AGR, FIN
