Hearing

<u>HB 1670</u> RELATING TO MOBILE CLINICS. HUS, FIN

<u>Status</u> Appropriates funds to the department of human services to purchase,

staff, and operate mobile treatment clinics that provide services

throughout the night.

HB 2186 RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. HUS, FIN

Status Requires the Department of Human Services to develop a safe parking

program allowing unsheltered persons who sleep in their vehicles to park overnight on state lands. Requires a report to the Legislature.

HB 2284 Status RELATING TO THE HAWAII ABLE SAVINGS PROGRAM.

HUS, FIN

Repeals language that gives the Director of Finance discretion to use moneys in the Hawaii ABLE Savings Program Trust Fund if the Director elects to accept deposits from contributors instead of sending deposits directly to the ABLE program manager. Authorizes the Director of Finance to expend moneys in the Hawaii ABLE Savings Program Trust Fund to provide incentive payments to Hawaii public school ABLE account owners. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. Makes an appropriation to the Department of Budget and Finance to fund the incentive payments. Makes an appropriation to the Department of Health for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent position within the State Council on Developmental Disabilities to provide statewide outreach, advocacy, and relationship management for the Hawaii ABLE savings program.

HB 2662

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

HUS, FIN

Status Requires the Hawaii public housing authority to establish a two-year

recreation and education upward mobility pilot program for youth tenants in public housing. Permits the Hawaii public housing authority to contract with outside parties to implement the program.

Appropriates funds.

HB 2185

RELATING TO MATERNAL HEALTH.

HUS, FIN

Status Requires the Department of Human Services to develop and administer

implicit bias training for health care professionals in perinatal facilities.

Decision-Making

The following measure(s) were previously heard on **02-06-24**. No public testimony will be accepted.

HB 2555 Status RELATING TO THE CHILD PROTECTIVE ACT.

HUS, JHA

Amends the definition of "aggravated circumstances" under the Child Protective Act. Requires a service plan to include an evaluation or assessment of parents, including a primary aggressor assessment, by a professional with domestic violence training in

cases of family violence.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
