Aloha Chair Yamashita, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) strongly supports this bill, which gives practical effect to the intent of the Legislature that funds appropriated pursuant to Act 279, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, be available until June 30, 2025.

The Hawaii State Department of the Attorney General opined that Act 279 authorization is only until June 30, 2024, given certain constitutional provisions that limit biennial appropriations to three years. Thus, as Act 279 currently stands, funds not encumbered by June 30, 2024, would lapse. HB2420, HD1 provides clarity that should any funds lapse, an amount would be reappropriated to the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, in order to align with the apparent legislative intent that DHHL be provided three full years to encumber the funds appropriated under Act 279.

This bill was approved by the Hawaiian Homes Commission and included in the Governor's administrative package by the request of the Department.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: Gives practical effect to the intent of the Legislature that funds appropriated in Act 279, Session Laws of Hawai'i 2022, be available for expenditure until June 30, 2025.

SYNOPSIS: Makes technical changes to Act 279, SLH 2022, to conform with the original intent that the \$600 million appropriated to the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands not lapse until June 30, 2025.

EFFECTIVE DATE: June 29, 3000.

STAFF COMMENTS: This is an Administration measure sponsored by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands and designated HHL-06 (24).

The Foundation recognizes this bill as a technical fix to conform to the original intent of the bill without running afoul of limitations in the Hawaii Constitution.
