Chair Kidani, Vice Chair Kim, and members of the Committee:

The State Public Charter School Commission ("Commission") appreciates the opportunity to offer **SUPPORT on SB 3305** which amends Chapter 302D, the statutes governing public charter schools, by adding a new section applicable to Prekindergarten-only public charter schools. This section provides clarification on what sections of the charter school statutes Prekindergarten-only schools are exempt from.

For clarification, Prekindergarten-only public charter schools are public charter schools that only serve prekindergarten students and have no K-12 students. At its January 2024 general business meeting, the Commission approved the first Prekindergarten-only public charter school, PACT Parkway Villages Preschool.

The Commission is available to work with this committee, the DOE, and our public charter schools in moving this legislation forward.
