

#### **3. Public Purpose**

Aloha 'Īlio Rescue is a non-profit agency that provides a much needed and community-supported public service by spaying/neutering and rehoming stray, abandoned and owner-surrendered dogs, providing medical and other support to help struggling pet owners keep their pets and educating the public about the responsibilities of pet ownership.

### **II. Background and Summary**

#### **1. A brief description of the applicant's background;**

Aloha 'Īlio Rescue (AIR) was founded in 2010 in response to the overpopulation of dogs in east Hawai'i and quickly became a trusted and valued resource for the Island of Hawai'i. The rescue has grown from rehoming less than 200 dogs/year to more than 600 dogs in 2023. This work is accomplished with a small team of dedicated staff, fosters and volunteers, with a small facility on one acre of land in the lower Puna district on the east side of Hawai'i Island.

Aloha 'Īlio takes in stray and abandoned dogs, as well as those whose owners can no longer provide for them because of financial or health hardships or death. Many of the dogs are brought directly to us, but some are transferred to us from Hawai'i County



of veterinary care. We provide assistance with medical care and pet food as much as our funding allows in order to try to keep families together and prevent abandonment. When people cannot keep their dog, AIR provides a safe place for these families to bring their pets, where they can be assured that the dog will be well cared for and rehomed in a timely and thoughtful manner with families that can better provide for them.

AIR also serves the needs of individuals and families needing the unique companionship and bonding experience of having a dog appropriate to their lifestyle and situation, while feeling good about helping a rescued animal. More and more of these people are moving to the island, and our education programs are increasing the number of residents of this mindset. We do, however, in response to the overwhelming number of animals available for adoption, also ship dogs to adopters throughout the state and to facilities and adopters in the continental U.S., where there is less dog overpopulation pressure and more available adopters.

**5. Describe the geographic coverage.**

We expect that the majority of our intakes for adoption and community medical services will continue to be primarily from East Hawai'i, especially the Puna and Hilo districts. We will, however, continue to serve the entire Island of Hawai'i, and our adoption services will continue to serve the state as well as the nation.

### **III. Service Summary and Outcomes**

We are currently seeking funding for the first phase of the new rescue facility—the installation of kennels and fencing, which will greatly increase our ability to intake dogs and bring more people into the facility to meet and adopt the dogs. In following phases, the facility will include a medical center which will house Good Karma Spay Neuter Clinic, an educational center, and space for low cost spay/neuter and vaccination events.

Having a facility that can be opened to adopters will save a tremendous amount of staff time currently spent organizing and attending adoption events at outside venues. It will bring in more potential adopters, and more of the community that needs assistance with pet food, anti-parasitics and vaccinations. This will both serve the community better and save staff time currently spent distributing pet food and organizing medical support. In later phases, having Good Karma Spay Neuter Clinic on-site will also save tremendous amounts of staff time currently spent transporting animals to and from the clinic. Having an on-site education center will also save organization and travel time, as well as provide opportunities to reach far more individuals.

AIR will complete the work within one year of receiving the funds.

The board of directors will continue to meet regularly to monitor and evaluate the progress of programs and initiatives, taking into account statistics and community feedback.

Aloha 'Īlio Rescue has been in operation since 2010, growing in scale from helping less than 200 dogs/year to more than 700 dogs in 2024. AIR has garnered tremendous community trust and support during its time in operation.

The current facility is on one acre in Hawaiian Paradise Park. The facility includes:

- covered kennel area
- indoor kennel area for small dogs
- laundry room, meds storage, dog food preparation area
- office building containing the business office, staff break room, kitchen and bathroom; dog food and transport crate storage
- 4 fenced dog exercise areas, one with small pond

Note that AIR has a robust foster care program, so many of the dogs in care are in foster homes rather than at the facility.




found dogs). She has great communication skills, enabling her to train and supervise kennel technicians to a high level of competence in a short time.
