A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
- 2 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 3 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.
- 4 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that the devastating Maui
- 5 wildfires on August 8, 2023, was one of the worst natural
- 6 disasters in the State's history.
- 7 The legislature further finds that in response to the
- 8 growing threat of wildfires and other natural hazards, the
- 9 public utilities commission plays a critical role in the State's
- 10 efforts to strengthen critical infrastructure, mitigate risks,
- 11 protect utility customers, and ensure robust recovery following
- 12 extreme weather events.
- To effectively address these challenges, it is urgently
- 14 imperative for the public utilities commission to strengthen the
- 15 resilience and reliability of electric utility services in the
- 16 State. These initiatives will require consultants with

- 1 specialized expertise to provide technical assessments,
- 2 evaluations, and recommendations for mitigating storm-related
- 3 power outages, restoring the grid, rebuilding Maui
- 4 infrastructure, and preparing for direct impacts of other
- 5 natural disasters to the State.
- 6 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to make an
- 7 emergency appropriation out of the public utilities commission
- 8 special fund for the public utilities commission to procure the
- 9 services of specialized consultants to assist with the efforts
- 10 to strengthen the resilience and reliability of electric utility
- 11 services in the State, including helping review wildfire
- 12 mitigation plans of regulated public utilities.
- SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the public
- 14 utilities commission special fund established by section 269-33,
- 15 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the sum of \$700,000 or so much thereof
- 16 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to contract
- 17 consultant services for utility dockets to assist with the
- 18 efforts to strengthen the resilience and reliability of electric
- 19 utility services in the State, including helping review wildfire
- 20 mitigation plans of regulated public utilities.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the public
- 2 utilities commission for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
