A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that appropriate, timely
- 2 pain management is an integral part of ensuring high quality,
- 3 patient-centered health care. As the rising danger of opiates
- 4 became clear, the legislature acted to put quardrails in place
- 5 to protect patients from the harmful effects of overprescribing,
- 6 long-term use, and addiction. However, the legislature
- 7 recognizes the need to balance these protections with the need
- 8 for timely patient access to appropriate pain management.
- 9 Therefore, there is a need to remove barriers to short-term
- 10 opiate prescriptions while maintaining protections against
- 11 overprescribing and patient misuse.
- 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to allow a patient
- 13 who has been seen in person by a health care provider to be
- 14 prescribed a three-day supply of opiates via telehealth by a
- 15 physician within the same medical group.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 453-1.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

1	"(c) Treatment recommendations made via telehealth,
2	including issuing a prescription via electronic means, shall be
3	held to the same standards of appropriate practice as those in
4	traditional physician-patient settings that do not include
5	[+]an[+] in-person visit but in which prescribing is
6	appropriate, including on-call telephone encounters and
7	encounters for which a follow-up visit is arranged. Issuing a
8	prescription based solely on an online questionnaire is not
9	treatment for the purposes of this section and does not
10	constitute an acceptable standard of care. For the purposes of
11	prescribing opiates or certifying a patient for the medical use
12	of cannabis, a physician-patient relationship shall only be
13	established after an in-person consultation between the
14	prescribing physician and the patient[-]; provided that a
15	patient who has been seen in person by a health care provider in
16	the same medical group as the prescribing provider authorized
17	pursuant to section 329-33, may be prescribed an opiate
18	prescription for a three-day supply or less via telehealth."
19	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

- 1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 2 provided that the amendments made to section 453-1.3(c), Hawaii
- 3 Revised Statutes, by section 2 of this Act shall not be repealed
- 4 when that section is reenacted on December 31, 2025, pursuant to
- 5 section 8 of Act 107, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023.
