# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS CEMETERIES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish the		
2	veterans cemeteries board, composed of representatives from		
3	federal, state, and county departments and agencies, to provide		
4	veterans cemeteries in the State with guidance, education,		
5	technical assistance, and other support to ensure compliance		
6	with standards set by the National Cemetery Administration of		
7	the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.		
8	SECTION 2. Chapter 363, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
10	and to read as follows:		
11	"§363- Veterans cemeteries board. (a) There shall be		
12	established the veterans cemeteries board within the office in		
13	the department of defense for administrative purposes only. The		
14	veterans cemeteries board shall:		
15	(1) Identify compliance issues faced by veterans		
16	cemeteries in the State, the resources needed, and the		
17	challenges encountered by departments or agencies that		

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1		manage veterans cemeteries, and work collaboratively
2		to resolve any issues;
3	(2)	Devise solutions to address the issues identified in
4		paragraph (1) and implement the solutions
5		collaboratively with the state and county departments
6		and agencies represented on the board;
7	(3)	Seek resources, including funding, legislative
8		initiatives, and intergovernmental program support;
9		and
10	(4)	Interact with and invite interested community
11		agencies, organizations, stakeholders, and veterans
12		and citizens to participate in discussions and board
13		meetings.
14	(b)	The veterans cemeteries board shall consist of the
15	following	members:
16	(1)	The director, or the director's designee, who shall
17		serve as the chairperson of the board;
18	(2)	A representative of the National Memorial Cemetery of
19		the Pacific, by invitation of the director;
20	(3)	The director of the department within the county of
21		Hawaii that is responsible for operating and

1		maintaining the county's veterans cemeteries, or the
2		director's designee;
3	(4)	The director of the department within the county of
4		Kauai that is responsible for operating and
5		maintaining the county's veterans cemeteries, or the
6		director's designee;
7	(5)	The director of the department within the county of
8		Maui that is responsible for operating and maintaining
9		the county's veterans cemeteries, or the director's
10		designee; and
1	(6)	The cemetery operations manager of the Hawaii state
12		veterans cemetery, or the manager's designee.
13	The	members of the veterans cemeteries board shall serve
14	without c	ompensation but may be reimbursed for necessary
15	expenses,	including travel expenses, incurred in the performance
16	of their	duties. A majority of the members of the veterans
17	cemeterie	s board shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of
8	the busin	ess of the board. A majority vote of the members
9	present a	t a meeting at which a quorum is established shall be
20	necessary	to validate any action of the veterans cemeteries
21	board.	

1	<u>(c)</u>	The veterans cemeteries board shall develop strategies
2	and make	recommendations to meet compliance standards set by the
3	National	Cemetery Administration of the United States Department
4	of Vetera	ns Affairs. In developing the recommendations, the
5	veterans	cemeteries board shall create, develop, and adopt a
6	statewide	framework, which shall include:
7	(1)	A clear understanding of the compliance standards for
8		cemetery grounds and maintenance set by the National
9		Cemetery Administration;
10	(2)	Strategies and recommendations for grounds and
1		maintenance best practices to address the various
12		challenges and conditions of each cemetery location;
13		and
4	(3)	A standardized system of data collection and
5		information sharing to support the intergovernmental
6		efforts of the board.
17	<u>(d)</u>	The office shall provide necessary staff and other
8	support r	equired by the veterans cemeteries board for the
9	performan	ce of its duties.
20	<u>(e)</u>	The veterans cemeteries board shall submit a report of
1	the beard	La findings and recommendations including any proposed

- 1 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 2 to the convening of each regular session."
- 3 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
