A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WINDSHIELD TINTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TION 1. The legislature finds that darker tints on car
2	windows h	ave a measurable impact on reducing heat trapped in a
3	car's int	erior. The legislature additionally finds that the
4	current 1	ight transmittance limit of thirty-five per cent for
5	glazing o	n car windows is inadequate to address the increased
6	temperatu	res caused by climate change.
7	The	purpose of this Act is to:
8	(1)	Prohibit a person from installing, mounting, adhering,
9		affixing, or using any sun screening device in
10		conjunction with the glazing material of a motor
11		vehicle with mirrored or high reflective finishes that
12		produce a red, yellow, amber, or blue appearance;
13	(2)	Require all drivers and passengers of motor vehicles
14		with applied tint to fully roll down their windows
15		when stopped by a law enforcement officer at a traffic
16		stop, subject to certain exceptions:

1	(3)	Clarify the light transmittance levels on sun
2		screening devices used in conjunction with glazing
3		material for front side windows and wing windows;
4	(4)	Exempt rear windows, including rear windshields on
5		certain vehicles, and side windows to the rear of the
6		driver on sedans from sun screening device
7		requirements;
8	(5)	Increase the minimum and maximum fines for violating
9		sun screening device requirements; and
10	(6)	Make the absence of the certificate certifying that a
11		sunscreen device complies with the law in a vehicle
12		prima facie evidence that an installer is noncompliant
13		with the law.
14	SECT	ION 2. Section 291-21.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to	read as follows:
16	"§291	1-21.5 Regulation of motor vehicle sun screening
17	devices; p	penalty. (a) No person shall operate, permit the
18	operation	of, cause to be operated, or park any motor vehicle or
19	a public h	nighway if the glazing material of the motor vehicle:

I	(1)	Does not meet the requirements of the rederal Motor
2		Vehicle Safety Standards 205 in effect at the time of
3		its manufacture; or
4	(2)	Is used in conjunction with sun screening devices not
5		exempted from this section by subsection [(d) hereof.]
6		<u>(e).</u>
7	(b)	No person shall install, mount, adhere, affix, or use
8	any sun s	creening device or combination of devices in
9	conjuncti	on with the glazing material of a motor vehicle
10	[which]:	
11	(1)	That does not meet the requirements of the Federal
12		Motor Vehicle Safety Standards 205 in effect at the
13		time of the glazing material's manufacture except as
14		provided in this section[-]; and
15	(2)	With mirrored or high reflective finishes that produce
16		a red, yellow, amber, or blue appearances as viewed
17		from the exterior of the motor vehicle.
18	Any p	person who violates this section shall be liable for
19	the remova	al of any sun screening device applied contrary to this
20	section.	

I	(C)	A safety inspection required under section (200-23)
2	<u>286-26</u> sh	hall include a test to ensure that the glazing material
3	and any s	sun screening devices meet the requirements specified in
4	this sect	cion.
5	(d)	Notwithstanding subsection (e), all drivers and
6	passenger	es of motor vehicles with applied tint shall fully roll
7	down thei	r windows when stopped by a law enforcement officer at
8	a traffic	stop. This subsection shall not apply to individuals
9	unable to	do so due to physical disability or mechanical
10	failure;	provided that the driver communicates or cooperates
11	through c	ther means reasonably available. A driver's or
12	passenger	's failure to comply with this subsection may be cited
13	as a nonc	riminal traffic infraction.
14	[-(d)	-] <u>(e)</u> This section shall not apply to:
15	(1)	Rearview mirrors;
16	(2)	Adjustable nontransparent sun visors [which] that are
17		mounted forward of the side windows and are not
18		attached to the glazing material;
19	(3)	Signs, stickers, or other materials [which] that are
20		displayed in a seven-inch square in the lower corner
21		of the windshield farthest removed from the driver or

1		Signs, Sciences, of other materials (which) that are
2		displayed in a five-inch square in the lower corner of
3		the windshield nearest the driver;
4	(4)	Rear trunk lid handle or hinges;
5	(5)	Window wipers and window wiper motors;
6	(6)	Transparent sun screening film materials [which] that
7		are installed, affixed, or applied along the top edge
8		of the windshield so long as [such] the materials do
9		not encroach upon the AS-1 portion of the windshield
10		as provided by Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard
11		205 or no lower than four inches below the top of the
12		windshield, when measured from the middle point of the
13		bottom edge of the top windshield moulding if no AS-1
14		markings can be found in the left or right upper
15		margin of the windshield;
16	(7)	Sun screening devices for front side wing vents and
17		windows [which,] that, when used in conjunction with
18		the glazing material, have a light transmittance of no
19		less than thirty-five per cent plus or minus six per

cent;

1	(0)	sun screening devices for front side windows and wing
2		windows necessary for driving visibility [which] that
3		are <u>adjacent</u> to the [rear of the] driver and [for rear
4		<pre>windows] necessary for driving [visibility which,]</pre>
5		that, when used in conjunction with the glazing
6		material, have a light transmittance of no less than
7		thirty-five per cent plus or minus six per cent;
8	(9)	[Side] Rear windows [which are], including the rear
9		windshield on sedans, vans, minivans, trucks, buses,
10		or other motor vehicles; and side windows to the rear
11		of the driver [and rear windows] on sedans, vans,
12		minivans, trucks, or buses; provided that the vehicles
13		are equipped with rearview mirrors on both sides;
14	(10)	Privacy drapes, curtains, or blinds, or any
15		combination, installed on the interior of motor homes;
16		or
17	(11)	Transparent sun screening materials, when applied to
18		the AS-1 portion of the windshield, [which meets] that
19		meet the requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety
20		Standard 205.

1	[-(e)] (f) Any person who violates this section shall be
2	fined:
3	(1) [Not] No less than [$$250$] $$300$ [or] and no more than
4	[\$500] $$550$ for each separate offense if the person is
5	the owner of the motor vehicle [which] that is in
6	violation; and
7	(2) [Not] No less than [$$500 \text{ nor}$] $$700 \text{ and no}$ more than
8	[\$1,000] $$1,200$ for each separate offense if the
9	person or business entity is the installer of any sun
10	screening device [which] that does not meet the
11	requirements of this section. The installer shall
12	also reinstall sun protective devices [which] that
13	comply with this section, free of charge, or reimburse
14	the motor vehicle owner for the cost of installing sun
15	protective devices by another installer [\text{\text{\text{which}}} \text{ that}
16	comply with this section.
17	The receipt from the installer in the possession of the person
18	in the motor vehicle at the time of the issuance of the citation
19	shall be prima facie evidence of the identity of the installer.
20	The installer shall issue a certificate to the vehicle owner at
21	the time the sunscreen device is installed certifying that the

- 1 device complies with law. Failure of an installer to issue the
- 2 required certificate shall be considered a violation of this
- 3 section. The certificate shall be stored in the motor vehicle
- 4 at all times. The absence of the certificate in the vehicle at
- 5 the time of citation shall constitute prima facie evidence of
- 6 installer noncompliance.
- 7 (g) The department of transportation may adopt rules
- 8 pursuant to chapter 91 to establish standard criteria or visual
- 9 references for the enforcement of tint color and reflectivity
- 10 prohibitions."
- 11 SECTION 3. The department of transportation shall notify
- 12 all licensed motor vehicle inspection stations of the changes
- 13 made by this Act no later than ninety days after the effective
- 14 date of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 16 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 17 begun before its effective date.
- 18 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
