A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LOCAL AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that supporting local
- 2 agriculture and strengthening local food systems are a matter of
- 3 statewide concern that can improve the resilience of Hawaii's
- 4 economy, environment, culture, and public health. The
- 5 legislature further finds that setting clear and ambitious
- 6 target goals for the purchase of locally grown food ensures that
- 7 the State plays its role in supporting local farmers and
- 8 guarantees that revenue derived from local produce remains in
- 9 the State and feeds local people. Act 175, Session Laws of
- 10 Hawaii 2021 (Act 175), established a programmatic goal for the
- 11 department of education to provide a minimum of thirty per cent
- 12 locally sourced food in Hawaii public school meals by 2030. In
- 13 addition, the legislature also passed Act 176, Session Laws of
- 14 Hawaii 2021, and Act 144, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, which
- 15 established five-year benchmarks ensuring a certain percentage
- 16 of produce that is purchased by the department of education,
- 17 department of health, department of public safety (now the

- 1 department of corrections and rehabilitation), department of
- 2 defense, and university of Hawaii system is locally grown.
- 3 The legislature also finds that the existing goals set
- 4 different standards for various state departments.
- 5 Specifically, pursuant to Act 175, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021,
- 6 the programmatic goal for the department of education is to
- 7 locally source at least thirty per cent of food served in public
- 8 schools by 2030, which is higher than other state departments.
- 9 The legislature believes that the goals to provide
- 10 locally-sourced food should increase at a consistent and
- 11 predictable pace across all pertinent state departments to avoid
- 12 any confusion between departments; however, the legislature
- 13 recognizes that benchmark goals for certain departments should
- 14 be assessed on a more frequent basis than the department of
- 15 education.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to resolve some of the
- 17 discrepancies between the locally sourced food benchmarks for
- 18 the department of education and those of other state entities.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 27-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

1	(a) The department of education, department of hearth,
2	department of corrections and rehabilitation, department of
3	defense, and [University] university of Hawaii system shall each
4	ensure that a certain percentage of the food purchased for
5	public schools, youth campuses, public hospitals, public
6	prisons, and any purchases made directly by the [University]
7	university of Hawaii for use in its academic programs, as
8	applicable, is fresh local agricultural products and local
9	value-added, processed, agricultural, or food products, as
10	follows:
11	(1) By January 1, 2025, fresh local agricultural products
12	and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
13	food products shall constitute a minimum of ten per
14	cent of the total food purchased during each calendar
15	year, as measured by the per cent of total food cost;
16	provided that the department of education shall be
17	exempt from the requirements of this paragraph;
18	(2) By January 1, 2030, fresh local agricultural products
19	and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
20	food products shall constitute a minimum of eighteen
21	per cent of the total food purchased during each

1		calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total
2		food cost; provided that the department of education
3		shall be exempt from the requirements of this
4		paragraph and instead shall be subject to the
5		requirements in section 302A-405.6(a);
6	(3)	By January 1, 2035, fresh local agricultural products
7		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
8		food products shall constitute a minimum of twenty-six
9		per cent of the total food purchased during each
10		calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total
11		food cost; provided that the department of education
12		shall be exempt from the requirements of this
13		paragraph;
14	(4)	By January 1, 2040, fresh local agricultural products
15		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
16		food products shall constitute a minimum of
17		thirty-four per cent of the total food purchased
18		during each calendar year, as measured by the per cent
19		of total food cost;
20	(5)	By January 1, 2045, fresh local agricultural products
21		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or

1		food products shall constitute a minimum of forty-two	
2		per cent of the total food purchased during each	
3		calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total	
4		food cost; and	
5	(6)	By January 1, 2050, fresh local agricultural products	
6		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or	
7		food products shall constitute a minimum of fifty per	
8		cent of the total food purchased during each calendar	
9		year, as measured by the per cent of total food cost.	
10	SECT	ION 3. Section 302A-405.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
11	amended b	y amending its title and subsection (a) to read as	
12	follows:		
13	"[+]	§302A-405.6[] Farm to school meals. (a) [By 2030,	
14	the depar	tment shall meet the local farm to school meal goal	
15	that thirty per-cent of food served in public schools-shall		
16	consist of locally sourced products, as measured by the		
17	percentage of the total cost of food. The department shall		
18	ensure th	at by January 1, 2030, fresh local agricultural	
19	products	and local value-added processed, agricultural, or food	
20	products	shall constitute a minimum of thirty per cent of the

- 3 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
