A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VESSELS IN STATE COMMERCIAL HARBORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 266-61, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"[{]\$266-61[}] Labor subject to collective bargaining;		
4	required. [In] (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), in		
5	addition to the duties of the department of transportation		
6	imposed under part I, the department of transportation shall		
7	require that the securing of mooring lines from vessels to		
8	commercial docks, wharves, piers, quays, and landings be		
9	performed by labor subject to collective bargaining[; provided		
10	that nothing in this section shall be construed as requiring		
11	that-any].		
12	(b) Subsection (a) shall not apply to:		
13	(1) Any labor being performed at any shipyard or drydock;		
14	by or on behalf of any ship repair or construction		
15	company; or involving any activity relating to ship		
16	repair, construction and overhaul services, and		

1		maritime research and development [be subject to	
2		collective bargaining.]; and	
3	(2)	The securing of mooring lines from fishing vessels;	
4		government-owned or government-sponsored vessels; tour	
5		boats; and training vessels."	
6	SECTI	ION 2. This Act shall not be applied so as to impair	
7	any contra	act existing as of the effective date of this Act in a	
8	manner violative of either the Constitution of the State of		
9	Hawaii or	article I, section 10, of the United States	
10	Constitution.		
11	SECTI	ION 3. The provisions of this Act shall be enforced to	
12	the extent	they are not held to conflict with any federal or	
13	state constitutional provision, law, rule, or regulation. The		
14	provisions	s of this Act are not severable and if any provision of	
15	the Act, c	or the application thereof to any person or	
16	circumstar	nce is held to conflict with any deferral or state	
17	constitutional provision, law, rule, or regulation, this Act, in		
18	its entire	ety shall be invalid.	
19	SECTI	ION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
20	and strick	ken. New statutory material is underscored.	

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
