A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE FOOD HUB PILOT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's food
- 2 security may be strengthened by growing more food locally and
- 3 increasing access to local food. This endeavor may be supported
- 4 by establishing food hubs, which are centrally located
- 5 facilities that have a business management structure that
- 6 facilitates the aggregation, storage, processing, distribution,
- 7 and marketing of locally produced food products. By actively
- 8 coordinating these activities along the value chain, food hubs
- 9 may provide wider access to institutional and retail markets for
- 10 small- to mid-sized producers and increase consumer access to
- 11 fresh and healthy food, including for those consumers in
- 12 underserved areas and food deserts.
- Recognizing that food hubs often encounter financial
- 14 obstacles when seeking to launch or expand their operations, the
- 15 legislature passed Act 313, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, which
- 16 established a five-year food hub pilot program that provides
- 17 eligible applicants with financial assistance to establish and

- 1 expand food hub operations on a scale to meet local demand. The
- 2 legislature finds that additional funds are needed to continue
- 3 the pilot program to assist food hubs in the State.
- 4 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 5 funds for the continued implementation of the food hub pilot
- 6 program, including the awarding of grant moneys to qualifying
- 7 food hubs.
- **8** SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000 or so much
- 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
- 11 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 12 2026-2027 for the continued implementation of the food hub pilot
- 13 program established pursuant to Act 313, Session Laws of Hawaii
- 14 2022, including the awarding of grant moneys to qualifying food
- 15 hubs.
- 16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 17 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
