## A BILL FOR AN ACT

### RELATING TO THE CENTER FOR CULTURAL AND TECHNICAL INTERCHANGE BETWEEN EAST AND WEST, INC.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Center for 2 Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West Act of 3 1960, P.L. 86-472, authorized the establishment in Hawaii of a 4 center for cultural and technical interchange between East and West. Act 82, Session Laws of Hawaii 1975, established an 5 educational non-profit public corporation, the Center for 6 7 Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc., to administer and operate the center. 8

9 The legislature further finds that the established center 10 for cultural and technical interchange between East and West, better known and hereinafter referred to as the "East-West 11 Center", has become a pivotal institution in fostering 12 understanding and cooperation between the United States and the 13 nations of Asia and the Pacific. Hawaii's unique geographical 14 15 location and multicultural heritage make it an ideal location for promoting international relations, particularly within the 16 Asia-Pacific region. For over six decades, the East-West Center 17

has significantly contributed to Hawaii's role as a bridge
between the East and West, enhancing the state's position in
international affairs.

The legislature further finds that the East-West Center's 4 5 programs in research, education, and exchange have directly benefited Hawaii's economy, culture, and diplomatic relations. 6 While the federal government has provided significant funding to 7 the East-West Center, this federal support has fluctuated over 8 the years. The legislature recognizes that the center would 9 benefit from regular, predictable State resources to support the 10 development of programs and initiatives that align with Hawaii's 11 strategic goals in international relations, education, and 12 13 economic development.

14 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to authorize from the general revenues of the State of Hawaii and exempt from the 15 requirements of chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, an annual 16 17 appropriation in the State's executive budget to the Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc. 18 SECTION 2. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 20 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 21

5	(3)	Agree not to use the funds for entertainment or

7	(4)	Be incorporated under the laws of the State;
8	(5)	Have bylaws or policies that describe the manner in
9		which the activities or services for which funds are
10		awarded shall be conducted or provided;
11	(6)	Have been determined and designated to be a tax-exempt
12		organization by the Internal Revenue Service; and
13	(7)	Have a governing board whose members shall have no
14		material conflict of interest and serve without
15		compensation.
