RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. There are appropriated or authorized from the
3 sources of funding indicated below to collective bargaining
4 statewide (BUF 102) the following sums or so much thereof as may
5 be necessary to fund for fiscal biennium 2025-2027 all
6 collective bargaining cost items in the agreement negotiated
7 with the exclusive representative of collective bargaining unit
8 (1):

PART VII

SECTION 13. Salary increases and cost adjustments provided in this Act for any officer or employee whose compensation is paid, in whole or in part, from federal, special, or other funds



1 shall be paid wholly or proportionately, as the case may be,
2 from the respective funds.

3 SECTION 14. Funds appropriated or authorized by this Act
4 that are not expended or encumbered by June 30, 2026, and
5 June 30, 2027, of the respective fiscal years, shall lapse as of
6 those dates.

7 SECTION 15. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
8 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
9 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
10 that the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year
11 2025-2026 has already been exceeded by \$, or per
12 cent. In addition, the appropriations contained in this Act
13 will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal
14 year 2025-2026 to be further exceeded by \$, or one per
15 cent. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure
16 ceiling are that the appropriations made in this Act are
17 necessary to serve the public interest and to meet the needs
18 addressed by this Act.

19 SECTION 16. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
