TITLE:

PURPOSE:

To provide appropriations for collective bargaining cost items and other public employment costs for the members of Unit (6) and their excluded counterparts, including the cost of salary adjustments negotiated between the State and the bargaining unit representative for fiscal

biennium 2025-2027.

MEANS:

By the submittal of a specific appropriation measure.

JUSTIFICATION:

Appropriations by the Legislature are necessary to cover the expected cost of implementing the collective bargaining agreement negotiated between the State and the respective bargaining unit representing state public officers and employees for the fiscal biennium commencing July 1, 2025.

Inasmuch as an agreement with the bargaining unit was not reached in time to include all cost items in the 2025-2027 biennium budget, a separate measure is proposed for submittal to the Legislature.

Impact on the public: "[I]t is the public policy of the State to promote harmonious and cooperative relations between government and its employees and to protect the public by assuring effective and orderly operations of government. These policies are best effectuated by: (1) Recognizing the right of public employees to organize for the purpose of collective bargaining; (2) Requiring public employers to negotiate

with and enter into written agreements with exclusive representatives on matters of wages, hours, and other conditions of employment, while, at the same time,

maintaining the merit principle pursuant to section 76-1 " (Section 89-1(b),

Hawaii Revised Statutes).
