BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the school
 facilities authority was established to oversee the development,
 planning, and construction of public school facilities across
 the State of Hawaii, ensuring that schools meet the
 infrastructure needs of students, staff, and communities.

Section 302A-1704, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 13 The board shall consist of [five] seven voting 14 members. [The] 15 (1) Five of the members shall: 16 $[\frac{1}{1}]$ (A) Be appointed by the governor pursuant to 17 section 26-34; 18 $[\frac{(2)}{(2)}]$ (B) Have an interest in public school 19 facilities: 20 $[\frac{3}{3}]$ (C) Include one member actively or previously 21 engaged in the construction industry for at least 22 five years; and

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1	$\left[\frac{(4)}{(1)}\right]$ Serve without compensation but may be
2	reimbursed for expenses, including travel
3	expenses, necessary for the performance of their
4	duties[-]; and
5	(2) Two of the members shall be:
6	(A) The superintendent of education or the
7	superintendent's designee; and
8	(B) The chairperson of the board of education or the
9	chairperson's designee."

11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EDUCATION.

PURPOSE:

Adds two additional members that represent the Department of Education (Department) or the Board of Education to the School

Facilities Authority Board.

MEANS:

Amends section 302A-1704(b), Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

This bill is necessary to ensure that the planning and development of school facilities in Hawaii by the School Facilities Authority (Authority) are closely aligned with the educational goals and priorities of the State's public education system. Currently, the School Facilities Authority Board solely consists of members appointed by the Governor, which may not reflect the insights and strategic priorities of the Department, the entity most directly involved in the operation and management of public schools.

By incorporating representatives from the Department and Board of Education as voting members of the School Facilities Authority Board, this bill aims to strengthen collaboration among these agencies and enhance the Authority's accountability. This change to the composition of the School Facilities Authority Board will ensure that decisions about school infrastructure more closely reflect the educational needs of students, educators, and the broader community, leading to more effective and responsive school facilities development.

Impact on the public: More effective and responsive school facilities development will improve educational outcomes, community pride, and property values of the community.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
Because the Department is the end user of
facilities developed by the Authority, the
addition of representatives of the

Department and the Board of Education to the

School Facilities Authority Board will increase the likelihood of usefulness of

facilities.
