RELATING TO NUISANCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- The legislature finds that the department of 1 SECTION 1. health's responsibility to protect both public and environmental 2 health is essential, especially as climate change increases 3 4 pressures on resources and communities. The recognition that the health of a community is closely tied to environmental 5 conditions underscores the importance of preventing threats to 6 the environment. Therefore, it is critical that the department 7 8 of health has the clear legal authority and mandate to act not

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 322, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending the title of part I to read as follows: 3 "PART I. PREVENTION AND ABATEMENT OF NUISANCES" 4 SECTION 3. Section 322-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 "§322-1 [Removal, prevention.] Prevention; abatement; 7 destruction; removal. The department of health and its agents 8 shall examine into all nuisances, such as foul or noxious odors, gases or vapors, water in which mosquito larvae exist, sources 9 10 of filth, and all causes of sickness or disease, on shore, and 11 in any vessel, which may be known to them or brought to their 12 attention, [which] that in their opinion are dangerous or 13 injurious to public health or environmental health, or both, and 14 into any and all conditions created or existing [which] that 15 cause or tend [to-cause-sickness or disease or] to be dangerous 16 or injurious to public health or environmental health, or both, 17 and shall [eause the same to be abated, destroyed, removed, or 18 prevented.] prevent, abate, destroy, or remove the nuisance or 19 condition that causes a nuisance." 20 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
