A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TAX ADMINISTRATION.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 76-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 "(b) The civil service to which this chapter applies shall 4 comprise all positions in the State now existing or hereafter 5 established and embrace all personal services performed for the 6 State, except the following: 7 (1) Commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Hawaii 8 National Guard and positions in the Hawaii National 9 Guard that are required by state or federal laws or **10** regulations or orders of the National Guard to be 11 filled from those commissioned or enlisted personnel; 12 Positions filled by persons employed by contract where (2) 13 the director of human resources development has 14 certified that the service is special or unique or is 15 essential to the public interest and that, because of 16 circumstances surrounding its fulfillment, personnel

to perform the service cannot be obtained through

1		normal civil service recruitment procedures. Any
2		contract may be for any period not exceeding one year;
3	(3)	Positions that must be filled without delay to comply
4		with a court order or decree if the director
5		determines that recruitment through normal recruitment
6		civil service procedures would result in delay or
7	·	noncompliance, such as the Felix-Cayetano consent
8		decree;

8	director of transportation, with the approval of the
9	governor; one additional deputy in the department of
10	human services either in charge of welfare or other
11	functions within the department as may be assigned by
12	the director of human services; four additional
13	deputies in the department of health, each in charge
14	of one of the following: behavioral health,
15	environmental health, hospitals, and health resources
16	administration, including other functions within the
17	department as may be assigned by the director of
18	health, with the approval of the governor; two
19	additional deputies in charge of the law enforcement
20	programs, administration, or other functions within
21	the department of law enforcement as may be assigned
22	by the director of law enforcement, with the approval

9		an administrative assistant to the superintendent of

12		other law; provided that:
13		(A) Any exemption created after July 1, 2014, shall
14		expire three years after its enactment unless
15		affirmatively extended by an act of the
16		legislature; and
17		(B) All of the positions defined by paragraph (9)
18		shall be included in the position classification
19		plan;
20	(18)	Positions in the state foster grandparent program and
21		positions for temporary employment of senior citizens

1		in occupations in which there is a severe personnel
2		shortage or in special projects;

15		procedures would result in delay or noncompliance;

5	human services, the business technology analyst;

7	[+](38)[+ Senior] The software developer supervisor and senior
8	software developers in the department of taxation;

20	Nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect the civil
21	service status of any incumbent as it existed on July 1, 1955."

PURPOSE:

To permanently exempt the following positions in the Department from civil service: The data privacy officer and tax business analysts in the Director's office

and the software developer supervisor.

MEANS:

Amend section 76-16(b), Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Department proposes permanently exempting certain positions from civil service: The data privacy officer and tax business analysts in the Director's office and the software developer supervisor. These exempt positions will be crucial as the department enhances its operational capacity.

The data privacy officer will coordinate, develop, and implement applicable privacy requirements and manage privacy risks through the department-wide privacy program. This position will be responsible for ensuring the Department complies with federal, state, and other applicable policies and protects the sensitive information of taxpayers and the Department. Additionally, this position will oversee data sharing and exchanges for compliance with privacy requirements.

Tax business analysts will be responsible for managing both business and technical changes required to properly implement complex tax law changes. The analysts will ensure all updates comply with the law and meet the needs of taxpayers.



A software developer supervisor will supervise senior software developers, who implement complex system changes.

Impact on the public: None.

Impact on the Department and other agencies: The Department will strengthen its ability to administer the tax system and improve the coordination of internal business processes to meet its obligations to protect taxpayer information and manage privacy risks through secure data sharing and exchanges with federal, State, and other government partners.
