TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

PURPOSE:

To exempt from the Hawaii Public Procurement Code (Procurement Code) contracts by government bodies to procure certain

construction projects.

MEANS:

Amend section 103D-102(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

Section 103D-102(b)(4)(M), HRS, provides a procurement exception for situations when it is not practicable nor advantageous to use one of the allowable methods of procurement for the acquisition of goods and services.

There may be situations when it is either not practicable or not advantageous to competitively procure for a construction project. This bill would allow the Chief Procurement Officer the ability to exempt a construction project from Procurement Code requirements when it is either not practicable or not advantageous to competitively procure.

Impact on the public: The exemption to the Procurement Code created by this bill is narrow and only to be allowed when approved by the Chief Procurement Officer after a showing that it is either not practicable or not advantageous to procure construction projects competitively.

Impact on the department and other agencies: This bill requires the Chief Procurement Officer to determine that the competitive procurement of a certain construction project is either not practicable or not advantageous to the State before the project can be exempted from the Procurement Code.
