### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHER WORKFORCE HOUSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that teachers are
- 2 fundamental to shaping the future of Hawaii's keiki and
- 3 communities. However, areas in the State with schools that are
- 4 hard to staff still face significant challenges in attracting
- 5 and retaining qualified educators due to limited affordable
- 6 housing options and the State's high cost of living.
- 7 The legislature further finds that challenges with teacher
- 8 retention have resulted in a growing reliance on emergency hires
- 9 and long-term substitutes, which can negatively affect the
- 10 quality of education for students and place additional financial
- 11 strain on the department of education. Addressing teacher
- 12 retention is critical to reducing educational disparities and
- 13 ensuring equitable access to high-quality learning opportunities
- 14 for all students in public and charter schools.
- 15 The legislature therefore finds that providing financial
- 16 assistance for housing through a teacher workforce housing
- 17 stipend program would support teacher retention in communities



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- 1 with schools that are hard to staff. Additionally, a stipend
- 2 program would help alleviate economic burdens and encourage
- 3 educators to make long-term commitments to teaching in
- 4 communities with schools designated as hard-to-staff.
- 5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 6 teacher workforce housing stipend program to support teacher
- 7 retention at any public school and charter school designated as
- 8 hard-to-staff, which will strengthen the teaching profession,
- 9 support educational equity, and invest in the success of
- 10 Hawaii's students and schools.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended by adding a new section to subpart E of part III to be
- 13 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 14 "§302A- Teacher workforce housing stipend program;
- 15 <u>hard-to-staff schools</u>. (a) There is established a teacher
- 16 workforce housing stipend program to be administered by the
- 17 department to support teacher retention at any public school and
- 18 charter school designated as hard-to-staff.
- 19 (b) An individual shall be eligible for stipend
- 20 consideration if the individual:

- 2 employment, as well as potential fees for the collection of
- 3 delinquent repayment.
- 4 (f) Stipends repaid by a stipend recipient pursuant to
- 5 subsection (e) shall be deposited into the teachers' housing
- 6 revolving fund established pursuant to section 302A-833.
- 7 (g) The department may accept federal funds to support the
- 8 teacher workforce housing stipend program.
- 9 (h) In accordance with chapter 103D, the department may
- 10 enter into written contracts with collection agencies to collect
- 11 delinquent repayment of stipends owed to the department pursuant
- 12 to subsection (e). A collection agency that enters into a
- 13 written contract with the department to collect delinquent
- 14 stipend repayments pursuant to this subsection may collect a fee
- 15 from the debtor in accordance with the terms of, and up to the
- 16 amounts authorized in, the written contract.
- 17 (i) The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
- 18 to implement and administer the stipend program, including the
- 19 terms of repayment pursuant to subsection (e).
- 20 (j) The department shall submit a report of its findings
- 21 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the

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- 1 legislature on the stipend program no later than twenty days
- 2 prior to the convening of the regular session for every odd-
- 3 numbered year, beginning with the regular session of 2027."
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 302A-833, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
- 6 "(a) There is established in the state treasury a
- 7 revolving fund to be known as the teachers' housing revolving
- 8 fund to be administered by the department of education. The
- 9 director of finance shall transfer any moneys appropriated for
- 10 the purposes of teacher housing to the teachers' housing
- 11 revolving fund. All unexpended balances of appropriations,
- 12 allocations, allotments, special revolving funds, or other funds
- 13 heretofore created and made available for the purposes of
- 14 developing or administering teachers' housing projects shall be
- 15 transferred to the teachers' housing revolving fund.
- 16 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, all moneys, including
- 17 refunds, reimbursements, and rentals, for housing from teacher
- 18 tenants, and all moneys received by the department pursuant to
- 19 302A- (f) shall be deposited in the revolving fund.

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1 (b) The revolving fund may be used by the department of 2 education for any and all of the purposes of teachers' housing, 3 including [the]: The planning, construction, maintenance, and operation 4 (1) 5 of teachers' housing[ , as well as for the]; 6 (2) The salaries of the necessary personnel in charge 7 thereof [-]; and 8 (3) The teacher workforce housing stipend program 9 established pursuant to section 302A- ." 10 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 12 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 13 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 14 year 2026-2027 for the establishment and administration of the 15 teacher workforce housing stipend program established pursuant 16 to section 2 of this Act. 17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 18 of education for the purposes of this Act. 19 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
