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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CANCER.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1       SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the cancer research  
2 center of Hawaii, known as the university of Hawaii cancer  
3 center, is one of seventy-one National Cancer Institute-  
4 designated cancer centers in the United States. It is the only  
5 center in Hawaii and the Pacific region. The legislature also  
6 finds that the university of Hawaii cancer center reduces the  
7 burden of cancer through research, education, patient care, and  
8 community outreach, with an emphasis on the unique ethnic,  
9 cultural, and environmental characteristics of Hawaii and the  
10 Pacific region.

11       Cancer incidence and mortality rates have decreased in  
12 Hawaii over the last decade, but despite this overall reduction,  
13 the disparities between ethnic populations continue to be of  
14 concern. Native Hawaiians continue to have the highest cancer  
15 incidence and mortality rates among men and women, including  
16 higher incidences of breast and ovarian cancers. Similarly,  
17 Filipino women have the highest incidences of ovarian and



1 thyroid cancer. The legislature recognizes the need to identify  
2 the root causes of these disparities. This includes determining  
3 the health risks associated with living in close proximity to  
4 certain environmental hazards and exposures, specifically the  
5 impact of county and private waste landfills in Nanakuli, Oahu,  
6 on the surrounding Native Hawaiian communities. The legislature  
7 finds that cancer research focusing on Native Hawaiians, Pacific  
8 Islanders, and Filipinos is a matter of statewide concern and is  
9 unique to Hawaii and the university of Hawaii cancer center and  
10 thus cannot be easily conducted anywhere else in the world.

11 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the  
12 university of Hawaii cancer center for a multiethnic cohort  
13 study focusing on the social determinants of health, lifestyles,  
14 environmental exposures, and resilience factors of Native  
15 Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, and Filipinos, including an  
16 analysis of the health effects and risks of individuals living  
17 in close proximity to both landfills in Nanakuli, Oahu.

18 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general  
19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so  
20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and  
21 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal



1 year 2026-2027 for the university of Hawaii cancer center to  
2 conduct a multiethnic cohort study focusing on the social  
3 determinants of health, lifestyles, environmental exposures, and  
4 resilience factors of Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, and  
5 Filipinos, including an analysis of the health effects and risks  
6 of individuals living in close proximity to landfills in  
7 Nanakuli, Oahu; provided that the analysis shall utilize water  
8 and soil sample data from the department of health and other  
9 agencies.

10 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the university  
11 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act; provided that no funds  
12 shall be expended unless matched by federal funds on a dollar-  
13 for-dollar basis.

14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
