#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAII BEACH DAY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that beaches are among
- 2 the most treasured natural and cultural resources in the State.
- 3 From their scenic beauty to their ecological importance,
- 4 Hawaii's beaches play a vital role in the lives of residents and
- 5 visitors. However, these iconic coastal areas face numerous
- 6 challenges, including erosion, pollution, and overuse.
- 7 The legislature further finds that an annual day of
- 8 celebration and observance would raise awareness about
- 9 environmental stewardship, encourage responsible beach use, and
- 10 highlight the ecological and cultural significance of Hawaii's
- 11 coastal areas. Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to
- 12 establish an annual Hawaii Beach Day to celebrate, promote, and
- 13 protect Hawaii's beaches.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 15 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 16 read as follows:

| 15 | The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii            |
| 16 | tourism authority for the purposes of this Act.                  |
| 17 | SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.                |
| 18 | SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;         |
| 19 | provided that section 4 of this Act shall take effect on July 1, |
| 20 | 2025.  |
