BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The legislature finds that seed banks are one 1 SECTION 1. 2 of the most prevalent and practical approaches to the 3 conservation of resources for habitat restoration and are 4 important in preserving plant biodiversity. Endemic seed 5 banking has become increasingly important as over one-half of 6 Hawaii's native flora are at risk of extirpation or extinction 7 due to human impacts. The legislature therefore finds that this 8 Act is an issue of statewide concern. 9 SECTION 2. (a) The university of Hawaii shall establish

10 an endemic plant seed bank pilot program.

(b) The pilot program shall focus on the development of a seed bank to preserve and promote the planting of plant species that are endemic to Hawaii.

(c) The university of Hawaii shall submit a report on its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2027.
