A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the mission of the
- 2 state foundation on culture and the arts is to promote,
- 3 perpetuate, preserve, and encourage culture and the arts as
- 4 central to the quality of life and people of the State. One of
- 5 the foundation's strategic priorities includes increasing public
- 6 accessibility to arts and culture.
- 7 The foundation administers the state art museum and the art
- 8 in public places and relocatable works of art programs, using
- 9 the works of art special fund created pursuant to
- 10 section 103-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and also issues grants
- 11 through its foundation grants program. The museum and these
- 12 programs aim to support, promote, and recognize the excellence
- 13 of the State's diverse artists; create, display, and maintain in
- 14 public places and the state art museum a collection of works of
- 15 art that represent the diversity and excellence of the State's
- 16 artistic expression; and provide the fullest possible access to

- 1 the highest quality aesthetic and educational experiences
- 2 available to all the citizens of the State.
- 3 The legislature further finds that the performing arts also
- 4 represent various mediums that express creativity through
- 5 singing, dancing, theatre, and musical performances. To ensure
- 6 a wide range of artistic creativity and expression in the State,
- 7 performing arts should also be recognized as a medium to provide
- 8 the State's residents and visitors with creative, educational,
- 9 and aesthetic performances that tell meaningful stories and
- 10 provide engaging experiences.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to further the foundation's
- 12 endeavors by:
- 13 (1) Establishing the performing arts grants program, under
- 14 the foundation's existing foundation grant program, to
- support performing arts in the State;
- 16 (2) Establishing the performing arts grants special fund;
- 17 (3) Clarifying the scope of the state foundation on
- 18 culture and the arts' responsibilities to include the
- 19 coordination, planning, promotion, marketing, and
- 20 execution of performing arts events;
- 21 (4) Amending the funding sources for the state art museum;

1	(5)	Amending the amounts required to be transferred by
2		agencies into the works of art special fund and the
3		allowable uses of moneys from the works of art special
4		fund;
5	(6)	Appropriating general funds and federal funds for the
6		operations of the state foundation on culture and the
7		arts; and
8	(7)	Appropriating general funds to provide grants under
9		the performing arts grants program.
10	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
11	by adding	two new sections to part II to be appropriately
12	designate	d and to read as follows:
13	" <u>§</u> 9−	Performing arts grants program. (a) There is
14	establish	ed a performing arts grants program, to be placed in
15	the found	ation for administrative purposes, to provide grants
16	for the c	oordination, planning, promotion, marketing, and
17	execution	of performing arts events.
18	(b)	The foundation shall administer the performing arts
19	grants pr	ogram in accordance with this part.
20	(c)	The foundation shall submit an annual report of
21	performin	g arts grants awarded and the outcomes of each

1	performing arts event that received a grant to the legislature
2	no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
3	session of 2026 and every regular session thereafter.
4	§9- Performing arts grants special fund. (a) There is
5	established in the state treasury the performing arts grants
6	special fund, to be administered by the foundation. The
7	revenues of the special fund shall consist of:
8	(1) Appropriations made by the legislature;
9	(2) Revenues or moneys derived from the foundation's
10	operations;
11	(3) Grants, gifts, and donations received by the
12	foundation; and
13	(4) All interest earned on moneys deposited in the fund.
14	The special fund shall be used for the coordination,
15	planning, promotion, marketing, and execution of performing arts
16	events.
17	(b) The foundation shall oversee and administer grants for
18	the coordination, planning, promotion, marketing, and execution
19	of performing arts events. Applications for grants shall be
20	made to the foundation and contain such information as the
21	foundation shall require. At minimum, the applicant shall show:

1	(1)	The name of the requesting organization and
2		individual;
3	(2)	The purpose of the grant;
4	(3)	The service to be supported by the grant;
5	(4)	The target group to be benefited;
6	(5)	The costs of the grant; and
7	(6)	That the grant shall be used for activities that are
8		consistent with the purposes of this chapter.
9	(c)	Grants shall only be awarded if:
10	(1)	The applicant has applied for or received all
11		applicable licenses and permits, when such is required
12		to conduct the work for which a grant is awarded;
13	(2)	The applicant agrees to comply with applicable
14		federal, state, and county laws;
15	(3)	All activities and improvements undertaken with funds
16		received shall comply with all applicable federal,
17		state, and county statutes and ordinances, including
18		applicable building codes and agency rules; and
19	(4)	The applicant will indemnify and hold harmless the
20		foundation, the State of Hawaii, and its officers,
21		agents, and employees from and against any and all

1	claims arising out of or resulting from activities
2	carried out or projects undertaken with funds provided
3	hereunder.
4	Every grant shall be monitored by the foundation to ensure
5	compliance with this chapter and the purposes and intent of the
6	grant and shall be evaluated annually to determine whether the
7	grant attained the intended results in the manner contemplated."
8	SECTION 3. Section 9-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended as follows:
10	1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
11	and to read:
12	"_Performing arts" includes arts or skills that are
13	intended to be performed before an audience, including but not
14	limited to dance, singing, musical performances, and theater."
15	2. By amending the definition of "arts" to read:
16	""Arts" includes music, dance, painting, drawing,
17	sculpture, architecture, drama, poetry, prose, crafts,
18	industrial design, interior design, fashion design, photography,
19	television, motion picture art, unique or decorative plants,
20	landscaping, and all other performing arts and creative activity
21	of imagination and beauty."

1	SECT	ION 4. Section 9-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to	o read as follows:
3	"[+]:	§9-21[] Purpose. The foundation shall administer the
4	art in pul	blic places and relocatable works of art programs,
5	[pursuant	to section 103-8.5, performing arts grants program,
6	and state	art museum to achieve the following purposes:
7	(1)	Replace in public state buildings the natural beauty
8		displaced in construction with works of art expressive
9		of the State's cultural, creative, and traditional
10		arts of its various ethnic groups;
11	(2)	Support, promote, and recognize excellence of the
12		State's diverse cultural, creative, and traditional
13		artists; and
14	(3)	Create, display, and maintain in public places and the
15		state art museum a collection of works of art, and
16		coordinate, plan, promote, market, and execute
17		<pre>performing arts events,</pre> that:
18		(A) [Represents] Represent the diversity and
19		excellence of the State's artistic expression;
20		and

1	(B) [Provides] <u>Provide</u> to all the citizens of the
2	State the fullest possible access to the highest
3	quality aesthetic and educational experiences
4	available."
5	SECTION 5. Section 9-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"[+]§9-22[+] State art museum; establishment. The state
8	art museum is established within the foundation. The operations
9	of the state art museum shall be funded and supported [by the
10	works of art special fund, pursuant to section 103-8.5.] by:
11	(1) Appropriations from the legislature;
12	(2) Federal grants and subsidies;
13	(3) Voluntary contributions; and
14	(4) Funds received pursuant to section 9-3(7)."
15	SECTION 6. Section 103-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	"§103-8.5 Works of art special fund. (a) There is
18	created a works of art special fund, into which shall be
19	transferred one per cent of all state fund appropriations for
20	capital improvements designated for the construction cost
21	element $[\div]$, up to a total amount not to exceed \$3,000,000 per

1	<u>fiscal</u> ye	ar; provided that this transfer shall apply only to
2	capital i	mprovement appropriations that are designated for the
3	construct	ion or renovation of state buildings. The one per cent
4	transfer	requirement shall not apply to appropriations from the
5	passenger	facility charge special fund established by section
6	261-5.5 a	nd the rental motor vehicle customer facility charge
7	special f	und established under section 261-5.6.
8	(b)	The works of art special fund shall be used solely for
9	[the foll	owing purposes:
10	(1)	Costs costs related to the acquisition of works of
11		art[, including any consultant or staff services
12		required to carry out the art in public places and
13		relocatable works of art programs;
14	(2)	Site modifications, display, and interpretive work
15		necessary for the exhibition of works of art;
16	(3)	Upkeep services, including maintenance, repair, and
17		restoration of works of art;
18	(4)	Storing and transporting works of art].
19	(C)	The [one per cent] total annual amount, which is
20	included	in all capital improvement appropriations, shall be
21	calculate	d at the time the appropriation bills are signed into

- 1 law. The moneys shall be transferred into the works of art
- 2 special fund upon availability of moneys from the
- 3 appropriations $[\cdot]$; provided that the total annual amount
- 4 transferred into the special fund shall not cause the fund
- 5 balance as of the end of the prior fiscal year to exceed
- 6 \$15,000,000. Each agency receiving capital improvement
- 7 appropriations shall calculate [the one per cent] its
- 8 proportionate share of the total annual amount and transfer the
- 9 moneys into the works of art special fund.
- 10 (d) The comptroller and the state foundation on culture
- 11 and the arts shall decide on the specific art objects to
- 12 acquire, giving first consideration to placing appropriate
- 13 pieces of art at the locations of the original appropriation.
- 14 The selection of, commissioning artists for, reviewing of
- 15 design, execution, and placement of, and the acceptance of works
- 16 of art shall be the responsibility of the comptroller and the
- 17 state foundation on culture and the arts in consultation with
- 18 the affected agency or department.
- 19 Expenditures from the works of art special fund shall be
- 20 made by the comptroller.
- 21 (e) The comptroller shall:

1	(1)	Provide each agency receiving capital improvement
2		appropriations with information regarding items that
3		shall be included and excluded from [the one per cent]
4		the agency's proportionate share of the total annual
5		amount;
6	(2)	Ensure that each agency calculates its [one per cent]
7		proportionate share of the total annual amount
8		correctly; and
9	(3)	Ensure that each agency transfers the correct amount
10		to the works of art special fund in a timely manner.
11	(f)	The comptroller and the executive director shall track
12	amounts d	ue from each agency under the one per cent requirement
13	as provid	ed in this section."
14	SECT	ION 7. The following sums or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary	for fiscal year 2025-2026 and fiscal year 2026-2027
16	are appro	priated or authorized, as the case may be, from moneys
17	in the tr	easury received from general revenues and federal funds
18	to be exp	ended by the state foundation on culture and the arts
19	to financ	e the positions and other cost items listed below. The
20	letter sy	mbols used after the specific appropriations indicate

- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
- 4 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 5 year 2026-2027 to provide grants under the performing arts
- 6 grants program.
- 7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the state
- $oldsymbol{8}$ foundation on culture and the arts for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

Report Title:

State Foundation on Culture and the Arts; State Art Museum; Performing Arts Grants Program; Performing Arts Grants Special Fund; Works of Art Special Fund; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes the Performing Arts Grants Program to support performing arts in the State. Clarifies the scope of the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts' responsibilities to include the coordination, planning, promotion, marketing, and execution of performing arts events. Allows the use of moneys from the Performing Arts Grants Special Fund for performing arts. Appropriates funds to provide grants under the Performing Arts Grants Program and for the operations of the State Foundation on the Culture and the Arts. Includes additional funding sources for the State Art Museum. Clarifies that the Works of Art Special Funds shall only be used for costs related to the acquisition of works of art. Effective 7/1/3000. (PROPOSED HD2)

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
