A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 453-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) Before any applicant shall be eligible for licensure,
4	the applicant shall furnish proof satisfactory to the board
5	that:
6	(1) The applicant is of demonstrated competence and
7	professional knowledge; and
8	(2) The applicant is a graduate of:
9	(A) A medical school or college whose program leading
10	to the M.D. degree is accredited by the Liaison
11	Committee on Medical Education or whose program
12	leading to the D.O. degree is approved by the
13	American Osteopathic Association Commission on
14	Osteopathic College Accreditation, and has served
15	a residency of at least one year in a program
16	that has been accredited for the training of
17	resident physicians or osteopathic physicians by

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1		the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical
2		Education or the American Osteopathic
3		Association, respectively, or a residency of at
4		least one year in a program in Canada that has
5		been accredited for the training of resident
6		physicians by the Royal College of Physicians and
7		Surgeons of Canada, or the College of Family
8		Physicians of Canada; or
9	(B)	A foreign medical school [and] <u>listed in the</u>
10		World Directory of Medical Schools; has
11		demonstrated a proficiency in the English
12		language; has had at least two years of residency
13		in a program accredited by the Accreditation
14		Council for Graduate Medical Education or the
15		American Osteopathic Association[$ au$]; or has
16		completed a minimum of two years of higher level
17		clinical training as an international fellow who
18		was not in a position accredited by the
19		Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical
20		Education or the American Osteopathic Association
21		at a training institution accredited by the



1	Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical
2	Education or the American Osteopathic Association
3	and who has demonstrated clinical competence
4	comparable to that of an individual who has
5	graduated from a program accredited by the
6	Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical
7	Education or the American Osteopathic
8	Association; or has had at least two years of
9	residency in a program in Canada that has been
10	accredited for the training of resident
11	physicians by the Royal College of Physicians and
12	Surgeons of Canada, or by the College of Family
13	Physicians of Canada; and:
14	(i) Holds the national certificate of the
15	Educational Commission for Foreign Medical
16	Graduates, or its successor, or for
17	applicants with residency training in
18	Canada, has passed with scores deemed
19	satisfactory by the board, the Medical
20	Council of Canada Evaluating Examination, or
21	its successor; [or]

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1	(ii) Holds the certificate of the Fifth Pathway
2	Program of the American Medical Association;
3	or
4	(iii) Has passed the United States Medical
5	Licensing Examination (USMLE) with scores
6	deemed satisfactory by the board;
7	provided that for a period of two years after
8	June 26, 2004, the requirements of subsection
9	(b)(2)(B)(i) and (ii) shall not apply to any
10	applicant who has had four years of residency in
11	a program accredited by the Accreditation Council
12	for Graduate Medical Education or the American
13	Osteopathic Association and who has passed, with
14	scores deemed satisfactory by the board, the
15	Special Purpose Examination (SPEX)[+]; provided
16	further that the requirement that an applicant
17	complete at least two years of residency in an
18	accredited program shall not apply to any
19	applicant who has had at least one year of
20	fellowship training in a program whose parent
21	program or hospital is accredited by the

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1		Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical
2		Education or the American Osteopathic
3		Association, or who has had at least one year of
4		fellowship training in Canada in a program whose
5		parent program or hospital is accredited by the
6		Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of
7		Canada, or by the College of Family Physicians of
8		Canada; provided further that the board may waive
9		the residency requirement under this subparagraph
10		for an applicant who is a graduate from a foreign
11		medical school who has passed, with scores deemed
12		satisfactory by the board, the United States
13		Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) and who
14		provides services in a specialty that no other
15		physician licensed in the State provides."
16	SECTION 2.	Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.
18	SECTION 3.	This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

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Report Title:

Medical Students; Licensure; Requirements; Waiver; Foreign Medical Graduates; Exemptions

Description:

Specifies the types of foreign medical schools whose graduates may be accepted for licensure. Specifies licensure requirements for foreign medical graduates. Exempts foreign medical graduates from the residency requirements for medical licensure if the applicant had at least one year of fellowship training in a program whose parent program or hospital holds certain accreditations. Authorizes the Hawaii Medical Board to waive the residency requirements if the foreign medical graduate applicant has graduated from a foreign medical school, passed the USMLE, and practices in a specialty that no other licensed physician in the State practices in. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
