### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in 2024, the
- 2 department of agriculture launched a statewide process to
- 3 address key economic challenges facing the agricultural sector.
- 4 Agricultural producers and organizations expressed the need for
- 5 a unified vision and strategic approach to advance the industry.
- 6 The department of agriculture recognizes its pivotal role in
- 7 this transformation and has developed short-term actions and a
- 8 long-term strategy aimed at addressing complex issues in 2025
- 9 and beyond.
- 10 The existing agricultural statistics program plays a
- 11 crucial role in providing agricultural producers and
- 12 policymakers with essential data to guide short-term decision-
- 13 making and long-term strategic planning. However, the
- 14 department of agriculture recognizes the agriculture sector's
- 15 challenges with accessing accurate and timely data. This Act
- 16 aims to modernize the collection, analysis, and dissemination of
- 17 agricultural statistics, leveraging electronic data collection

1 methods to provide critical insights into the movement of agricultural goods into the State and between and within the 2 Hawaiian islands, and will include production, sales, and market 3 4 trends. 5 The objectives of this Act are to collect, analyze, and 6 report data on the production, distribution, and sale of select 7 agricultural products between and within the Hawaiian islands; 8 provide producers with the information needed to make informed 9 decisions about planting, scaling operations, and exploring new 10 market opportunities; provide other decision-makers with key 11 analysis of production, production opportunities, trends, and 12 growth; and support the strategic growth and development of 13 Hawaii's agricultural sector by enhancing the statistics 14 program's data collection, analysis, and reporting capabilities. 15 This Act will fill gaps in the department of agriculture's 16 role to gather, compile, and tabulate agricultural statistics 17 and will help fulfill its obligation under the cooperative 18 agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture, 19 ensuring robust data collection and reporting across the State. 20 The enhanced program will expand data collection on select

commodities, analyze trends, and identify growth opportunities

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- 1 between and within the Hawaiian islands. These improvements
- 2 will help producers make better informed decisions on planting,
- 3 operations, and market expansion, while adapting to changing
- 4 conditions. State and county policymakers can further use the
- 5 data to better allocate public resources to support agriculture
- 6 and the public.
- 7 These efforts align with the "Go B.I.G. for Agriculture"
- 8 initiative to boost local product availability and expand market
- 9 capacity, driving broader economic impact. By providing
- 10 actionable means, this Act will help producers optimize their
- 11 strategies, reduce costs, and expand market reach, contributing
- 12 to economic stability for agricultural businesses and the
- 13 broader Hawaii community.
- 14 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to revitalize and
- 15 enhance the department of agriculture's agricultural statistics
- 16 program and drive forward a key initiative under the
- 17 department's "Go B.I.G. for Agriculture" initiative to buy local
- 18 products, invest in agriculture's development, and grow
- 19 agriculture's scale, ultimately advancing the State's broader
- 20 goals for sustainable and economically viable agriculture
- 21 grounded in the cultural heritage of Hawaii.

12		movement of fresh fruit and vegetable products; and	
13	(3)	Establish a structured rotation schedule for sector-	
14		specific surveys to collect data on agricultural

16		(A) Agricultural theft;	
17		(B) Agricultural tourism;	
18		(C) Aquaculture;	
19		(D) Crop and livestock losses;	
20		(E) Farm technology;	
21		(F) Horticulture and nursery;	

1	(G)	Livestock numbers and productivity;			
2	(H)	Producer expansion;			
3	(I)	Seed;			
4	(J)	Tropical fruits;			
5	(K)	Vegetable and melons; and			
6	(L)	Other surveys, as determined by the department of

8	§148-	Exemption. (a) Data and information received by			
9	the department	for the purposes of this part shall be exempt			
10	from public disclosure under chapter 92F.				
11	(b) All	data collected, compiled, and stored in the			
12	agricultural statistics program shall be confidential and				
13	protected from	discovery, production, and disclosure, unless the			
14	information has been transformed into a statistical or aggregate				
15	form that does not allow the identification of the person who				
16	supplied particular information. Unauthorized review, use,				
17	disclosure, or	distribution of data shall be strictly			
18	prohibited.

1 §148-Collaboration. (a) The department may 2 collaborate with national and local entities, including the 3 United States Department of Agriculture National Agricultural 4 Statistics Service and Agricultural Marketing Service, United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, university of Hawaii college 5 6 of tropical agriculture and human resilience, university of Hawaii economic research organization, and other agencies as 7 8 needed, to enhance data collection, analysis, and reporting 9 efforts. 10 (b) The department of agriculture may establish 11 partnerships with local producers, transportation companies, 12 aggregators, and distributors to facilitate the electronic 13 capture of and access to other data sets." 14 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$880,000 or so much 15 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the 17 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 18 2026-2027 to carry out the purposes of this Act; provided that 19 the appropriated funds shall be allocated as follows: 20 \$170,000 for the establishment of two full-time 21 equivalent (2.0 FTE) agricultural economist positions;

1	(2)	\$280,000 for the establishment of four full-time	
2		equivalent (4.0 FTE) research statistician positions;	
3	(3)	\$130,000 for the establishment of secured office	
4		space, equipment, the development of electronic data	
5		collection systems, and program expenses for the	
6		islands of Hawaii, Kauai, Lanai, Maui, Molokai, and	
7		Oahu; and	
8	(4)	\$300,000 for contracted specialty surveys to be	
9		conducted by third-party entities focusing on critical	
10		agricultural data needs.	
11	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department		
12	of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
