A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1	. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y add	ing a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designate	d and	to read as follows:
4	" <u>§32</u>	1	Use of restraint or seclusion limited; minors;
5	vulnerabl	e adu	lts. (a) No hospital or other medical facility
6	shall res	train	or subject to seclusion a minor or vulnerable
7	adult pat	ient,	except:
8	(1)	When	<u>:</u>
9		<u>(A)</u>	Necessary to prevent injury to the patient or
10			others;
11		(B)	Part of a treatment plan; or
12		<u>(C)</u>	Necessary to preserve the rights of others; and
13	(2)	Only	after other less intrusive interventions have:
14		<u>(A)</u>	Failed; or
15		<u>(B)</u>	Been determined to be inappropriate for the
16			<pre>patient;</pre>

1	provided that the restraint or seclusion shall only be used for			
2	as long as the danger from not using the restraint or seclusion			
3	persists.			
4	(b) No physical restraint may be imposed on any patient			
5	that is threatening to the life of the patient, including			
6	physical restraint that may restrict breathing.			
7	(c) As used in this section:			
8	"Chemical restraint" means a drug or medication			
9	administered to a patient to control behavior or restrict			
10	freedom of movement; provided that the term does not include a			
11	drug or medication that is:			
12	(1) Prescribed by a licensed physician, or other qualified			
13	health professional acting under the scope of the			
14	professional's authority under state law, for the			
15	standard treatment of a patient's medical or			
16	psychiatric condition; and			
17	(2) Administered as prescribed by a licensed physician or			
18	other qualified health professional acting under the			
19	scope of the professional's authority under state law.			

1 "Mechanical restraint" means the use of devices to restrict 2 a patient's freedom of movement or ability to communicate in the 3 patient's primary language or mode of communication. 4 "Physical restraint" means a personal restriction, other 5 than a chemical or mechanical restraint, that immobilizes or 6 reduces the ability of a patient to move the patient's arms, 7 legs, or head freely. 8 "Restraint" means: 9 A mechanical restraint; (1)10 (2) A chemical restraint; or 11 (3) A physical restraint. 12 "Seclusion" means the confinement of a patient alone in a 13 room or structure from which the patient is physically denied 14 voluntary egress." 15 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 16 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 17 begun before its effective date.

SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

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1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
