A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's beach
- 2 parks, scenic viewpoints, hiking trailheads, cultural sites,
- 3 wildlife habitats, and other natural resources are popular
- 4 destinations for visitors to the State. However, these sites
- 5 are often located alongside congested state highways or county
- 6 roads with limited parking.
- 7 The legislature further finds that there are
- 8 community-based organizations that collaborate with the State,
- 9 counties, visitor industry, and impacted neighborhoods to
- 10 address traffic congestion in these areas, such as the shuttle
- 11 system currently in use in Haena, Kauai, which reduces the
- 12 number of vehicles on the narrow Kuhio highway. This shuttle
- 13 system generates revenues to fund shuttle operations, as well as
- 14 improvements at the Haena state park, parking attendant
- 15 salaries, and the costs of maintaining and expanding loi and
- 16 cultural sites within Haena state park.

2	organizat	ions that provide transportation services from the			
3	State's m	otor carrier law, under certain circumstances.			
4	SECTION 2. Section 271-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
5	amended to read as follows:				
6	"§271-5 Exemptions, generally. Notwithstanding any other				
7	provision	s of this chapter, its contents shall not apply to:			
8	(1)	Persons transporting their own property where the			
9		transportation is in furtherance of a primary business			
10		purpose or enterprise of that person, except where the			
11		transportation is undertaken by a motor carrier to			
12		evade the regulatory purposes of this chapter;			
13	(2)	Persons operating motor vehicles when engaged in the			
14		transportation of school children and teachers to and			
15		from school, and to and from school functions;			
16		provided that these persons may engage in providing			
17		transportation at special rates for groups of persons			
18		belonging to an eleemosynary or benevolent			
19		organization or association domiciled in [this] the			
20		State where the organization or association sponsors			
21		or is conducting a nonregular excursion; provided			

1		furt	ther that whenever the persons engage in the		
2		trar	asportation of persons other than those exempted in		
3		this	s paragraph, that portion of their operation shall		
4		not	be exempt from this chapter. Nothing in this		
5		para	graph shall be construed to authorize any person		
6		to e	engage in the transportation of persons, other than		
7		the	transportation of persons exempted by the terms of		
8		this	this paragraph, without a permit or certificate issued		
9		by t	by the commission authorizing such transportation;		
10	(3)	Pers	Persons operating taxicabs or other motor vehicles		
11		util	utilized in performing a bona fide taxicab service.		
12		"Tax	"Taxicab" includes:		
13		(A)	Any motor vehicle used in the movement of		
14			passengers on the public highways under the		
15			following circumstances, namely the passenger		
16			hires the vehicle on call or at a fixed stand,		
17			with or without baggage for transportation, and		
18			controls the vehicle to the passenger's		
19			destination;		
20		(B)	Any motor vehicle for hire having seating		
21			accommodations for eight or fewer passengers used		

in the movement of passengers on the public highways that may, as part of a continuous trip, pick up or discharge passengers from various unrelated locations; provided that they shall be regulated by the counties in accordance with section 46-16.5(c); [and] provided further that this subparagraph shall not apply to any exclusive rights granted by the department of transportation for taxicab services at facilities under the department's control; and

(C) Any motor vehicle having seating accommodations for eight or fewer passengers used in the movement of passengers on the public highways between a terminal, i.e., a fixed stand, in the Honolulu district, as defined in section 4-1 and a terminal in a geographical district outside the limits of the Honolulu district, and vice versa, without picking up passengers other than at the terminals or fixed stands; provided that the passengers may be picked up by telephone call from their homes in the rural area or may be

1		unloaded at any point between the fixed stands or
2		may be delivered to their homes in the rural
3		area;
4	(4)	Persons operating motor vehicles in the transportation
5		of persons pursuant to a franchise from the
6		legislature and whose operations are presently
7		regulated under chapter 269;
8	(5)	Nonprofit agricultural cooperative associations to the
9		extent that they engage in the transportation of their
10		own property or the property of their members;
11	(6)	Persons operating motor vehicles specially constructed
12		for the towing of disabled or wrecked vehicles but not
13		otherwise used in the transportation of property for
14		compensation or hire;
15	(7)	Persons operating motor vehicles in the transportation
16		of mail, newspapers, periodicals, magazines, messages,
17		documents, letters, or blueprints;
18	(8)	Persons operating funeral cars or ambulances;
19	(9)	Persons operating motor vehicles in the transportation
20		of garbage or refuse;

1	(10)	Persons operating the type of passenger carrying motor
2		vehicles known as "sampan buses" within the radius of
3		twenty miles from the city of Hilo, Hawaii;
4	(11)	Persons transporting unprocessed pineapple to a
5		cannery, seed corn to a processing facility, or
6		returning any containers used in [such] the
7		transportation to the fields;
8	(12)	Sugar plantations transporting sugarcane, raw sugar,
9		molasses, sugar by-products, and farming supplies for
10		neighboring farmers pursuant to contracts administered
11		by the United States Department of Agriculture;
12	(13)	Persons engaged in the ranching or meat or feed
13		business who transport cattle to slaughterhouses for
14		hire where such transportation is their sole
15		transportation for hire and where their earnings from
16		the transportation constitute less than fifty per cent
17		of their gross income from their business and the
18		transportation for hire;
19	(14)	Persons transporting unprocessed raw milk to
20		processing plants and returning any containers used in

1		(such) the transportation to dairy larms for
2		reloading;
3	(15)	Persons transporting animal feeds to animal husbandry
4		farmers and farming supplies directly to animal
5		husbandry farmers and returning any containers used in
6		[such] the transportation to these sources of [such]
7		the feeds and supplies for reloading;
8	(16)	Persons engaged in transporting [not] no more than
9		fifteen passengers between their places of abode, or
10		termini near such places, and their places of
11		employment in a single daily round trip where the
12		driver is also on the driver's way to or from the
13		driver's place of employment;
14	(17)	Persons transporting passengers without charge in
15		motor vehicles owned or operated by [such] the person,
16		where [such] the transportation is provided in
17		conjunction with and in furtherance of a related
18		primary business purpose or enterprise of that person,
19		and [such] the transportation is provided only
20		directly to and from the place of business of [such]
21		the person, except that this exemption shall not apply

1		to persons making any contract, agreement, or
2		arrangement to provide, procure, furnish, or arrange
3		for transportation as a travel agent or broker or a
4		person engaged in tour or sightseeing activities, nor
5		shall this exemption apply where the transportation is
6		undertaken by a person to evade the regulatory
7		purposes of this chapter; [and]
8	(18)	Persons conducting the type of county-regulated
9		passenger carrying operation known as "jitney
10		services". For the purposes of this paragraph,
11		"jitney services" means public transportation services
12		utilizing motor vehicles that have seating
13		accommodations for six to twenty-five passengers,
14		operate along specific routes during defined service
15		hours, and levy a flat fare schedule[+]; and
16	(19)	Community-based organizations engaged in
17		community-based economic development providing
18		transportation services; provided that:
19		(A) The transportation services are operated within
20		the parameters of a state- or county-approved .
21		plan that is contracted or regulated under the

1		authority of that state or county government
2		agency. The state or county government agency
3		shall require, or may exceed, the minimum
4		requirements for commercial and business
5		insurance required under section 271-17;
6	<u>(B)</u>	The community-based organization owns the
7		transportation service-related assets, and these
8		assets cannot be sold for personal gain for the
9		duration of the exemption from this chapter;
10	(C)	Community stakeholders have a role in the
11		operation of the community-based organization;
12		and
13	(D)	The state or county government agency shall
14		notify the commission of the agency's
15		determination that the community-based
16		organization qualifies for this exemption.
17		For the purposes of this paragraph:
18		"Community-based economic development" has the
19	same	meaning as defined in section 210D-2.
20		"Community-based organization" has the same
21	mean	ing as defined in section 210D-2.

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1	"Community stakeholders" means individuals,
2	groups, or other organizations within the
3	geographically defined area served by, and that have a
4	direct interest in the activities and outcomes of, the
5	community-based organization and community-based
6	economic development."
7	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
3	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
)	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
