A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that school health
- 2 assistants, pursuant to section 302A-853, Hawaii Revised
- 3 Statutes, may administer medications to students in public
- 4 schools. However, due to vacancies, many schools experience
- 5 challenges in meeting the needs of students who are prescribed
- 6 medications or may benefit from receiving medications in
- 7 emergency situations while on campus.
- 8 The legislature further finds that school staff acting as
- 9 volunteers can be an effective substitute after completing
- 10 training and general instruction in tasks such as correctly
- 11 interpreting the health care provider's orders; identifying the
- 12 correct route of administration of medication, either oral or
- 13 nasal; confirming the correct dosage; administering the
- 14 medications at the right time; and duly documenting events.
- 15 Skilled nursing services such as those that require a license,
- 16 are out of scope for both school health assistants and trained
- 17 volunteers.

	a] other practitioner with prescriptive authority;
