
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the use of aerial
2 fireworks during celebrations continues to cause significant
3 disruption and concern. The legislature believes that a
4 stronger deterrent is needed to curtail the use of illegal
5 fireworks. According to the 2011 Report of the Illegal
6 Fireworks Task Force to the Legislature for the Regular Session
7 of 2011, an increase in fines associated with illegal fireworks
8 may act as a stronger deterrent.

9 The purpose of this Act is to increase the fines that may
10 be assessed against certain fireworks-related violations.

11 SECTION 2. Section 132D-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

13 "(b) Except as provided in subsection (a) or as otherwise
14 specifically provided for in this chapter, any person violating
15 any other provision of this chapter, shall be fined [~~not~~] not
16 more than [~~\$5,000~~] \$ _____ for each violation.

17 Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in this section,



1 any person violating section 132D-14.5 shall be fined [~~at least~~
 2 \$500] not less than \$ _____ and [~~no~~] not more than [~~\$5,000.~~]
 3 \$ _____."


4 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
 6 begun before its effective date.

7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
