A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WINDSHIELD TINTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that darker tints on car
- 2 windows have a measurable impact on reducing heat trapped in a
- 3 car's interior. The legislature additionally finds that the
- 4 current light transmittance limit of thirty-five per cent for
- 5 glazing on car windows is inadequate to address the increased
- 6 temperatures caused by climate change.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 8 (1) Prohibit a person from installing, mounting, adhering,
- 9 affixing, or using any sun screening device in
- 10 conjunction with the glazing material of a motor
- 11 vehicle with mirrored, metallic, red, yellow, amber,
- or blue tint;
- 13 (2) Require all drivers and passengers of motor vehicles
- with applied tint to roll down their windows when
- 15 stopped by a law enforcement officer at a traffic
- 16 stop;

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(1) Rearview mirrors;

- (5) Window wipers and window wiper motors;
- (6) Transparent sun screening film materials [which] that are installed, affixed, or applied along the top edge of the windshield so long as [such] the materials do not encroach upon the AS-1 portion of the windshield as provided by Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 205 or no lower than four inches below the top of the windshield, when measured from the middle point of the bottom edge of the top windshield moulding if no AS-1 markings can be found in the left or right upper margin of the windshield;

19		combination, installed on the interior of motor homes;

- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

Motor Vehicles; Window Glazing; Levels

Description:

Prohibits a person from installing, mounting, adhering, affixing, or using any sun screening device in conjunction with the glazing material of a motor vehicle with mirrored, metallic, red, yellow, amber, or blue tint. Requires all drivers and passengers of motor vehicles with applied tint to roll down their windows when stopped by a law enforcement officer at a traffic stop. Lowers the minimum light transmittance levels for sun screening devices on certain motor vehicles. Exempts side windows to the rear of the driver and rear windows on sedans from sun screening device requirements. Increase the minimum and maximum fines for violating sun screening device requirements. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

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
