A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TORTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many forms of cruel 2 and degrading sadism are inadequately addressed by the current 3 criminal law. Some acts occur during aggravated kidnappings or 4 following repeated assaults. Other acts, such as starvation or 5 electrocution, may inflict immense suffering without technically causing bodily injury. The common denominator for torture is 6 the pervasive physical and psychological control exercised over 7 8 the victim by the abuser.

9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to prohibit torture10 in the State.

SECTION 2. Chapter 707, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

14 "<u>\$707-</u> Torture. (1) Any person who:

15 (a) Knowingly causes serious bodily injury to another

3	(4) Torture is a class A felony."
4	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
5	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
6	begun before its effective date.
7	SECTION 4. If any provision of this Act, or the
8	application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
9	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
10	applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
11	invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
12	of this Act are severable.
13	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
