A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION OF CRIMINAL DEFENDANTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 704-404, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (11) to read as follows:
- 3 "(11) The compensation of persons making or assisting in
- 4 the examination, other than those retained by a nonindigent
- 5 defendant, who are not undertaking the examination upon
- 6 designation by the director of health as part of their normal
- 7 duties as employees of the State or a county, shall be paid by
- 8 the [State.] judiciary in the amount of \$2,000, which amount
- 9 includes compensation for the examination, the drafting of the
- 10 report, and any consultation, preparation, testimony, and
- 11 attendance in court."
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 704-407.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by amending subsection (12) to read as follows:
- 14 "(12) The compensation of persons making or assisting in
- 15 the examination, other than those retained by a nonindigent
- 16 defendant, who are not undertaking the examination upon
- 17 designation by the director of health as part of their normal



- 1 duties as employees of the State or a county, shall be paid by
- 2 the [State.] judiciary in the amount of \$2,000, which amount
- 3 includes compensation for the examination, the drafting of the
- report, and any consultation, preparation, testimony, and 4
- 5 attendance in court."
- 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$975,000 or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
- 9 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 10 2026-2027 to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary
- 12 for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
